1	PCET: learning and teaching in the post compulsory sector / Tummons, Jonathan - Sage Publication London , 2020 ;XI, 369p.	53150
	This book encourages readers to critically evaluate the context of PCET in the UK and opens up their learning through introducing some global profiles. The text explores learners in the sector, the diversity of the sector, the challenges and some topical contemporary themes. It covers a breadth of content and can thus be used as a general course text for all PGCE (PCET) courses as well as other education programmes. Through pedagogical features including critical questions, teacher and learner voices, links to practice and more, the text provides a resource for all those learning about PCET.	
2	Penal sanctioning in the United States : explaining cross-state differences / Laubepin, Frederique A. - LFB Scholarly Publishing El Paso , 2015 ;xiv, 185p.	53151
	This book delves into the variations in penal sanctioning across American states over three decades. She builds on existing studies on incarceration rates and extends the analysis to include parole revocation. Contrary to prior findings, political factors show weak influence, while local social, economic, and cultural conditions play significant roles. Laubepin emphasizes the historical and contextual nuances shaping penal policies, highlighting the interplay between top-down policies and bottom-up democratic engagement. This study underscores the importance of understanding state-specific dynamics in the sentencing system.

Moreover, this book performs an audit on which country is better placed to tackle corruption and professionalise their police service. It offers a major contribution to comparative research on criminal justice. It is essential reading for all policing scholars and will be of interest to students of criminology, social and political sciences, development studies, Asian studies, and post-colonial studies.	
4	Policing and the politics of order-making / Albrecht, Peter ; Kyed, Helene Maria - Routledge New York, 2015 ;xvi, 202p.	53153
	The book delves into urban spaces where multiple order-making practices, norms, and actors coexist amidst contestation and fluidity. It examines how state police and civilian policing groups interact, sometimes in competition, other times in collaboration or interdependence. It explores the connections of ageing with spirituality, nature and existentialism, and leisure to encourage creativity, individuation, happiness, and emotional detachment. It further examines various interventions such as end-of-life care, mindfulness and yoga, retrospection, life review, and so on, which may improve the overall quality of life by promoting the health of the elderly individual. The book focuses on authentic ageing, transpersonal gerontology, the concept of the elder child, geriatric interventions, and caregiving, and suggests practical improvements in health and facilities for the elderly. It also covers aspects of the inner life of the prolonged ailing or dying person from a mental health perspective and emphasizes the value of positive ageing. A guide to applied geriatrics and geriatric psychology, with its simple style and clear methods in end-to-end praxis, the book shows how mental well-being can be fostered in the elderly to help them find meaning and purpose in old age. It explores the concept, comparing it with alternatives like Ostracism and Business as Usual, and argues for its greater consideration. Through case studies from China, Burma, Zimbabwe, and Liberia, the book examines the effectiveness of Principled Engagement and identifies factors contributing to its success or failure. Written by leading academics and practitioners, it offers broad insights into international human rights policy, challenging readers to reassess conventional approaches and embrace innovative strategies.

- 11 Principled negotiation and mediation in the international arena : talking with **53160**

This book argues that it can be beneficial for the United States to talk with 'evil' - terrorists and other bad actors - if it engages a mediator who shares the United States' principles yet is pragmatic. It shows how the US can make better foreign policy decisions and demonstrate its integrity for promoting democracy and human rights, by employing a mediator who facilitates disputes between international actors by moving them along a continuum of principles, as political parties act for a country's citizens. This is the first book to integrate theories of rule of law development with conflict resolution methods, and it examines ongoing disputes in the Middle East, North Korea, South America and Africa. It draws on the author's experiences with The Carter Center and judicial and legal advocacy training to provide a sophisticated understanding of the current situation in these countries and of how a strategy of principled pragmatism will give better direction to US foreign policy abroad.

- 12 Privatizing peace: how commerce can reduce conflict in space/ Cobb, Wendy **53161**
N Whitman - Routledge New York , 2020 ;viii, 137p.

This book explores the privatization of space and its global impact on the future of commerce, peace and conflict. As space becomes more congested, contested, and competitive in the government and the private arenas, the talk around space research moves past NASA's monopoly on academic and cultural imaginations to discuss how Elon Musk's SpaceX and Jeff Bezos' Blue Origin is making space "cool" again. This volume addresses the new rhetoric of space race and weaponization, with a focus on how the costs of potential conflict in space would discourage open conflict and enable global cooperation. It highlights the increasing dependence of the global economy on space research, its democratization, plunging costs of access, and growing economic potential of space-based assets. Thoughtful, nuanced, well-documented, this book is a must read for scholars and researchers of science and technology studies, space studies, political studies, sociology, environmental studies, and political economy. It will also be of much interest to policymakers, bureaucrats, think tanks, as well as the interested general reader looking for fresh perspectives on the future of space.

Highlighting concrete cross-cultural relational spaces of concentric and diametric spatial systems, the book argues that transition between these systems offers a new paradigm for understanding agency and inclusion in developmental and educational psychology, and for relating experiential dimensions to causal explanations. The chapters examine key themes for developing concentric spatial systemic responses in education, including school climate, bullying, violence, early school leaving prevention and students' voices. Moreover, the book proposes an innovative framework of agency as movement between concentric and diametric spatial relations for a reconstruction of resilience. This model addresses the vital neglected issue of resistance to sheer cultural conditioning and goes beyond the foundational ideas of Bronfenbrenner's ecological systems theory, as well as Vygotsky, Skinner, Freud, Massey, Bruner, Gestalt and postmodern psychology to reinterpret them in dynamic spatial systemic terms. The book attempts to cover almost all the currently available advances of information technology and its use in library automation. The book would be useful for working librarians and library professionals in refreshing/upgrading their knowledge about the uses of advanced information technology tools in library. For students, it would help in filling the gap between LIS school curriculum and the current requirements of IT skills/expertise needed in getting good placements. It is expected that LIS students would extensively use this book while appearing for SET/NET exams. While reading the book, readers will get a feel of encyclopedic nature covering all the latest information technology tools available at the international level and their use in library automation. Topics such as using internet in library management, internet security, developing a digital library, metadata, data-mining and data warehousing techniques, electronic security systems for a library, management of e-resources, using web 2.0 technology tools in library, open access resources, semantic web, e-publishing, cloud computing, big data, BIBFRAME, and the concept of green library have been discussed in the book in detail. It is hoped that the present book would act as a guide and would certainly inspire librarians

in planning, modernizing, and reinventing their libraries in the light of future technologies.

Therefore, the titles of the chapters in this book do not include any names of statistical methods such as 'analysis of variance' or 'analysis of covariance'. In a total of seventeen chapters, this book covers a wide range of topics of research questions that call for experimental designs and statistical methods, fairly basic or more advanced.
