The author charts the key events and turning points in the triangular relationship between India, China, and Southeast Asia since the times of Jawaharlal Nehru, and unravels its importance in the construction of the Asian and global strategic order. The book shows how India's pre-eminent role in designing the regional architecture in Asia was diluted after the Bandung era, especially post the Sino-India War in 1962, and how, by the 1980s, it had become a political and diplomatic non-entity-if not a pariah-in Southeast Asia even as China emerged as a dominant regional power over the next three decades. Each chapter takes on a specific policy area, examining it in terms of Greece's economic reality and offering possible directions for policy. The topics range from macroeconomic issues to markets and their regulation to finance to the public sector. Individual chapters address the costs and benefits of participation in the eurozone, Greece's international competitiveness, taxation, pensions, the labor market, privatization, product markets, finance, education, healthcare, corruption, the justice system, and public administration. The contributors argue that Greek institutions require a deep overhaul rather than quick fixes to enable long-term growth and prosperity.

 Understanding South China sea geopolitics/ Subhadeep Bhattacharya--New
 Delhi: Pentagon Press, 2017
 South China Sea is fast emerging as a major zone of conflict in the East
 Asian, especially Southeast Asian, geopolitics. Although the soul of the
 conflict remains the century's old territorial dispute over possession of some
 geographical features of this maritime zone, it is gradually transcending the
 periphery of inter-state territorial feud and emerging as the driving force of
 an Asian cold war of the twenty-first century. The book here is an attempt to
 study the South China Sea geopolitics of today with reference to its past and
 investigate its character. The study here does not revolve round the
 territorial disputes and their historical character and legality but rather
 attempts to focus on the larger context of traditional intermingling of
 regional and extra-regional actors shaping the maritime geopolitics there in
 the past and at present, sometimes independent of the disputes while
 sometimes in their context. Here reference of India is also made given her

 Political internet: state and politics in the age of social media/ P.R. Bijju --
 London: Routledge, 2017
 This book investigates the internet as a site of political contestation in the
 Indian context. It widens the scope of the public sphere to social media, and
 explores its role in shaping the resistance and protest movements on the
 ground. The volume also explores the role of the internet, a global
 technology, in framing debates on the idea of the nation state, especially
 India, as well as diplomacy and international relations. It also discusses the
 possibility of whether the internet can be used as a tool for social justice and
 change, particularly by the underprivileged, to go beyond caste, class,
 gender and other oppressive social structures.

 Us, relatives: scaling and plural life in a forager world/ Nurit Bird-David--
 California: University of California Press, 2017
 Anthropologists have long looked to forager-cultivator cultures for insights
 into human lifeways. But they have often not been attentive enough to
 locals' horizons of concern and to the enormous disparity in population size
 between these groups and other societies. *Us, Relatives* explores how scalar
 blindness skews our understanding of these cultures and the debates they
 inspire. Drawing on her long-term research with a community of South
 Asian foragers, the author provides a scale-sensitive ethnography of these
 people as she encountered them in the late 1970s and reflects on the
 intellectual journey that led her to new understandings of their lifeways and
 horizons.

- 15 Bower, Adam 49868
Norms without the great powers: international law and changing social standards in world politics/ Adam Bower --Oxford: Oxford University Press, 2017
Can multilateral treaties succeed in transforming conduct when they are rejected by the most powerful states in the international system? In the past two decades, coalitions of middle-power states and transnational civil society groups have negotiated binding legal agreements in the face of concerted opposition from China, Russia, and most especially the United States. These instances of a so-called 'new diplomacy' reflect a deliberate attempt to use the language of international law to bypass great power objections in establishing new global standards. *Norms Without the Great Powers* presents a theoretical account and detailed empirical evidence regarding the implementation of two archetypal cases, the antipersonnel Mine Ban Treaty and International Criminal Court. Both treaties have substantially reshaped expectations and behaviour in their respective domains, but with important variation in the extent and breadth of their impact. These findings provide the impetus for assessing the prospects for similar strategies on other topics of contemporary global concern.
- 16 Cargill, Thomas F. 49818
Financial system, financial regulation and central bank policy/ Thomas F. Cargill--Cambridge: Cambridge University Press, 2017
The author explains the three core components of money and banking, and their interactions: 1) the financial system, 2) government regulation and supervision, and 3) central bank policy. He focuses on the interaction between government financial policy and central bank policy and offers a critique of the central bank's role in the economy, the tools it uses, how these tools affect the economy, and how effective these policies have been, providing a more balanced perspective of government policy failure versus market failure.
- 17 Chakrabarti, Rajesh 49887
Shaping policy in India: alliance, advocacy, activism/ Rajesh Chakrabarti and Kaushiki Sanyal --New Delhi: Oxford University Press, 2017
This book explores the interaction of political parties, bureaucracy, media, judiciary, and civil society groups in shaping policy in contemporary India. By researching the evolution of nine major legislations, the work interrogates the suitability of existing political theories to explain the policy development process in an emerging economy like India. It covers recent events such as the agitation for the Jan Lokpal Bill and the Nirbhaya case that have underlined the role of non-government players in law-making in India as well as long-standing movements like for right to information, right to education, and food security. It brings a new understanding to the process of policy in India.

- 18 Chanda, Ipshita 49781
 Selfing the city: single women migrants and their lives in Kolkata/ Ipshita Chanda--New Delhi: Sage Publications, 2017
 This ethnographical study explores the process of migration and its economic, social and psychological dimensions, throwing light on the connection between middle-class women migrants and city spaces. It highlights the emergence of a gendered citizen in an unknown and then gradually made-known or 'selfed' city. This includes challenging existing notions of empowerment, intimacy and security, suggesting how what women need brings forth changes in themselves and in the process shapes the future of cities.
- 19 Chandra, Manish 49865
 Modi's South Asia foreign policy: issues and concerns/ Manish Chandra -- New Delhi: Surendra Publications, 2017
 The foreign policy of Narendra Modi concerns the policy initiatives made towards other states by the current Modi government after he assumed office as Prime Minister of India on 26th may 2014. Modi foreign policy is currently focused on improving relations with neighbouring countries in South Asia engaging the extended neighbouring in Southeast Asia and the major global powers. The book discusses foreign policy of current government.
- 20 Chandrachud, Chintan 49905
 Balanced constitutionalism: courts and legislatures in India and the United Kingdom/ Chintan Chandrachud --New Delhi: Oxford University Press, 2017
 Unlike systems of parliamentary sovereignty and judicial supremacy, the Human Rights Act (HRA) of the UK, enacted in 1998, promised a new, 'balanced' model for the protection of rights, which conferred courts with a limited power of review over legislation. Under this new model, rights-based decision-making was expected to be balanced amongst courts and legislatures, rather than lopsided in favour of either. Indian courts, on the other hand, have always been constitutionally entrusted with the power to strike down primary legislation enacted by the Union and state legislatures. This book examines the promise of the new model against its performance in practice by comparing judicial review under the HRA to an exemplar of the old model of judicial review, the Indian Constitution. Balanced constitutionalism is not achieved through the legislative rejection of judicial decision-making about rights. Instead, the nature of the remedy under the HRA enables British courts to assert their genuine interpretations of rights in situations in which Indian courts find it difficult to do so.
- 21 Chandrashekhar, R. 49882
 Roots and knights: civil-military relations in India/ R. Chandrashekhar -- New Delhi: Pentagon Press, 2017
 The primary structures of control of India's Armed Forces evolved under the British rule. The course of evolution of these structures from the days of the East India Company and the Raj, their adaptation to conform to the requirements of a democracy, post-independence developments and the course this process needs to take to meet future requirements are some of the aspects this book attempts to explore.

Idea of nation and its future in India/ Shibani Kinkar Chaube --London: Routledge, 2017

This volume is a theoretic-empirical study of nations and nationalism on a global scale. It enquires if the idea of the nation, by its own logic, is feasible and whether India fulfils the requirement of nationhood with a reasonable prospect of survival. The monograph engages with the theories of nation and nationalism and examines if they are relevant and tenable in contemporary times. It looks at the way these ideas have acted out in the Indian nation while attempting to map its future trajectory. It also asks: how do the two fundamental challenges to the idea of nation – ethnicity and class – fare in the era of globalisation; and further, how does India, a new state in an ancient society, reconceptualize the paradigm of this debate?

 Foreign direct investment and the Chinese economy: a critical assessment/
 Chunlai Chen--Cheltenham: Edward Elgar Publishing, 2017
Foreign Direct Investment and the Chinese Economy provides a comprehensive overview of the impact of foreign direct investment, with extensive empirical evidence, on the Chinese economy over the last three and a half decades. The case studies show that despite FDI's contribution to economic growth, reduction of income inequality and the rise in urbanization, there is further evidence of uneven regional distribution of FDI inflow. This has negatively affected economic growth, exacerbated income inequality and impeded urbanization of inland China. The book concludes by demonstrating that these findings have important policy implications, not only for China, but also for other developing countries influenced by the implementation of FDI policies.
- 26 China and its neighbourhood: perspectives from India and Vietnam/ edited by 49909
 Jabin T. Jacob and Hoang The Anh --New Delhi: Pentagon Press, 2017
 This volume is an attempt to develop a more nuanced understanding of China's foreign, security and economic policies by bringing together perspectives from two of its most important neighbours, India and Vietnam. This book examines China's bilateral relations and its role in regional multilateral organisations as well as the balancing behavior of other powers in the region. In the process, this work also seeks to strengthen the sinews of the comprehensive strategic partnership between India and Vietnam by building closer ties between the research communities in the two countries and giving it greater analytical heft.
- 27 China and the BRICS: setting up a different kitchen/ edited by Srikanth 49910
 Kondapalli and Priyanka Pandit --New Delhi: Pentagon Press, 2017
 The volume is divided into two sections- the first is thematic, which deals with the broad issues of global governance and its debates; the second section focuses on the intra-BRICS relationships. Beginning with China's multilateral diplomacy, the book explores key debates in global governance that involves the rise of emerging powers, especially India and China, the issue of perception and reality, and the roles played by media and think tanks in institutionalizing the initiative as an effective representative of `South-South` cooperation. BRICS main focus areas on economy, energy and cyber security issues are extensively dealt with in this volume. In its second part, the volume has dealt with bilateral relations, where the individual relations between China and the other BRICS countries are being analysed.

- 28 China, East Asia and the European Union: strong economics, weak politics?/ edited by Jan van der Harst and Tjalling Halbertsma --Leiden: Brill, 2017 49812
 In *China, East Asia and the European Union* specialist authors from both Europe and Asia reflect on the dynamic relationship between the three actors from an International Relations perspective. The book is a testimony to China's seemingly unstoppable rise, both in the East Asian region and in the relationship with the EU and its member states. The authors investigate why the economic links between the European Union and East Asia have become so firmly established, while in comparison the political bond has remained underdeveloped. They conclude that the crises the EU is currently facing seriously affect its maneuvering space vis-a-vis China and its neighbours, both economically and politically.

 Gambling and war: risk, reward, and chance in international conflict/ Justin Conrad--Annapolis: Naval Institute Press, 2017
Gambling and war applies lessons learned from poker, blackjack, roulette, and other games of chance to the study of international conflict. Drawing on scholarly insights from a variety of fields, including probability, statistics, political science, psychology, and economics, the author offers thoughts on how we can better manage and prevent international conflict, the costliest game of all.

 Creativity without law: challenging the assumptions of intellectual property/ Kate Darling and Aaron Perzanowski --New Delhi: Sage Publications, 2017
 Intellectual property (IP) law assumes that creators have a fundamental legal right to prevent copying, and without this right they will under-invest in new work. But this premise ignores the range of powerful non-economic motivations that impel creativity and the capacity of creative industries for self-governance and innovative social and market responses to appropriation. This book reveals the on-the-ground practices of a range of creators and innovators who rely on evolving social norms and market responses, as per their particular cultural, competitive, and technological circumstances, to ensure creative incentives. The accounts presented here will help ground debates over IP policy in the empirical realities of the creative process.
- 31 Decentralisation, governance and development: an Indian perspective/ edited by Pranab Kumar Das--Hyderabad: Orient BlackSwan, 2017 49919
 India believed it could take development closer to its people, make the government more accountable, and empower women and oppressed communities through decentralisation—the provision of political and financial autonomy at the local level through the three-tier Panchayati Raj structure. Drawing from the examples of the two states where decentralisation has been most successful—Kerala and West Bengal—this volume explores the causes and effects of failures in implementation and issues of governance.

Russia in turn has brought back its long tradition of criticizing western liberalism and degeneracy to grandly rationalize its behavior in what are essentially local border skirmishes. It is this tendency to resort to the frames of earlier eras that has led the conflicts to "jump scales," moving from the regional to the global level in short order.
