They should not function in solitude with privileged elites alone, but in the context of "inclusive innovation systems."

Election 2014: a complete documentation & analysis of Indian parliamentary elections since 1952 --Delhi: Bookwell, 2015

The world's largest exercise in democracy, India's sixteenth general election, took nearly four weeks to complete. Spread over nine stages, 543 constituencies, 8251 candidates, representing some 300 parties compared for the ballots of an electorate of 814 m eligible voters. In 8, 30,866 polling stations 17, 20080 simple robust and apparently tamper proof electronic voting machines were deployed. With a continent sized voters, India has learned to pull off virtually flawlessly the biggest, eye-popping democratic exercise with the kind of ease that is a part of its new brand equity. The 16th Lok Sabha witnessed the highest ever turnout in the elections, that of 66.38 percentage. In itself, the turnout was a clear sign of the people crying over a change. To complete this mammoth exercise, the election commission had to negotiate a long list of potential obstacles when scheduling the poll; it took school exams, holidays, festivals, the harvest and even the monsoon into account. The organisational challenge of the polling was huge.

European society benefits from equality in income, excellent healthcare and basic education, good infrastructure, and developed institutions for the rule of law. But Europe has entered a period of economic stagnation and is distracted by multiple challenges. Economic and political strains have stalled vital reforms, while the threat of disunion is evident. By focusing on what works in Europe and the great variations within Europe, Aslund and Djankov show how Europe can develop a strategy for higher economic growth. They advocate a reduction of the fiscal role of the state, an opening up of services and digital trade, an easing of the regulatory and tax burdens on labor, an improved environment for start-ups and innovation, pension reform, and the development of Europe's energy union.

This is the first of two volumes covering Samuelson's extended and productive life and career. This volume surveys Samuelson's early years growing up in the Midwest to his experiences at the University of Chicago and Harvard University, where leading scholars in economics and other disciplines stimulated and rewarded his curiosity. His thinking was influenced by the natural sciences and he understood that a critical, scientific approach increased insights into important social and economic questions. He realized that these questions could not be answered through rhetorical debate but required rigor. His "eureka" moment came, he said, when "a good fairy whispered to me that math was a skeleton key to solve age old problems in economics."

 Managing Portfolio Credit Risk in Banks--New Delhi: Cambridge University Press, 2016

Credit risk is the risk resulting from the uncertainty that a borrower or a group of borrowers may be unwilling or unable to meet their contractual obligations as per the agreed terms. It is the largest element of risk faced by most banks and financial institutions. Potential losses due to high credit risk can threaten a bank's solvency. After the global financial crisis of 2008, the importance of adopting prudent risk management practices has increased manifold. Making cars in the new India: industry, precocity and informality--New Delhi: Cambridge University Press, 2018

Auto manufacturing holds the promise of employing many young Indians in relatively well-paid, high-skill employment, but this promise is threatened by the industry's role as a site of immense conflict in recent years. This book asks: how do we explain this conflict? What are the implications of conflict for the ambitious economic development agendas of Indian governments? Based upon extensive field research in India's National Capital Region, this book is the first to focus on labour relations in the Indian auto industry. It proposes the theory that conflict in the auto industry has been driven by twin forces: first, the intersection of global networks of auto manufacturing with regional social structures which have always relied on informal and precariously-employed workers; and, second, the systematic displacement of securely-employed 'regular workers' by waves of precariously-employed 'de facto informal workers'.

 Collected papers in theoretical economics, Vol.5: economic policy and its theoretical bases: using economic theory for Policymaking in Emerging Economies--New Delhi : Oxford University Press, 2018
- This book is a collection of the author's papers written over the last decade that broadly span over the area of economic theory for policymaking and is an addition to the author's well-known series 'Collected Papers in Theoretical Economics'. The volumes in this series deal with the philosophical foundations of economics and their applicability to a wide range of issues of immediate policy relevance.  Rhetoric of Hindu India: language and urban nationalism--New Delhi : Oxford University Press, 2017
- This book examines the late twentieth-century rise of the urban, right-wing Hindu nationalist ideology known as metropolitan Hindutva. This ideology, the book assesses, aspires to be a pan-Indian, urban form that is home to the emerging, digitally enabled, technocratic middle classes of the nation. Through close analyses of the writings of a range of self-styled public intellectuals, from Arun Shourie and Swapan Dasgupta to Chetan Bhagat and Amish Tripathi, this book maps this new avatar of Hindutva. Finally, in analyzing the language of metropolitan Hindutva, it arrives at an emerging idea of India as part of what Amitav Ghosh has called a contemporary Anglophone empire.  This edited volume analyzes recent key developments in EU border management.
