1	Against all odds: psychosocial distress and healing among women / Nayar, Mahima-SAGE: New Delhi, 2019; xiv, 256p.	52941

This book addresses the concerning trend of medicalization, where social problems are overshadowed by superficial treatments. Instead of addressing underlying issues, women are subjected to supposed treatments. The author, Nayar, critically examines this phenomenon and highlights the need for a more comprehensive understanding of psychosocial distress. Nayar's research in Delhi forms the basis for this exploration, providing a nuanced perspective on the challenges faced by women and the various local healing processes they seek. The book goes on to discuss the positive influence of the women's movement and cultural methods of healing in mitigating distress and violence in the daily lives of these women. By emphasizing the interactions between individuals and systems, "Against All Odds" argues that achieving an equitable society is crucial for reducing psychosocial distress. The book's interdisciplinary approach makes it a valuable resource for scholars in gender studies, psychology, psychotherapy, social work, and anthropology. This book deals with the problems of Muslim minorities in contemporary India. This book suggests that there are three principal reasons for a neglect of the socio-economic aspects of Indian Muslims during the period of neoliberal economic reforms. First, the problems of Muslims are inadequately understood by the governmental agencies and the political leadership. As a result, the state either ignores the real issues of the Muslims or tries to resolve them through a piecemeal approach. Secondly, the lack of a progressive leadership among the Indian Muslims has traditionally confined the problems of the community to the issues of identity and security instead of the demands for equity. Thirdly, popular Hindi cinema has misrepresented the identity of Indian Muslims by age-old stereotypes, demonisation and vilification without showing the actual problems of the Muslim minorities. As a result, the wrong notions, misconception, and myths regarding Muslims only proliferate and permeate among large sections of the Indian population while the structural problems of the Muslims hardly get attention for remedy. Finally, without being trapped in the Muslim question, this book has proposed three routes of radical democratic politics along with visions for a post-neoliberal order of reimagining India in the 21st century.
