Overview

It is widely regarded that social science research (SSR) enhances our understanding of the society and its functioning, provides policy inputs for socio-economic development and generates new ideas and information that could be used for teaching and research. Thus, social science research renders vital services to the society and the country.

India has a long and rich tradition of social sciences teaching and research. Takshashila, Nalanda, Vikramashila, Valabhi and Pushpagiri Universities flourished as global centres of learning in different parts of India. Social science teaching and research, however, made a formal beginning with the introduction of modern university system in the second half of the 19th century and the University of Mumbai (1857), University of Madras (1857), University of Calcutta (1857), Allahabad University (1875) etc. came into existence. The real breakthrough came only after Independence when higher education system expanded at a rapid rate as a part of the programme of planned socio-economic development. As the country's development process threw up numerous and diverse problems that required extensive research and analysis, Government of India established a Committee for Social Science Research under the chairmanship of Professor V.K.R.V Rao in 1965 to survey the social science research scenario in the country and make recommendations to accelerate its progress. This led to the establishment of

the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR) in 1969 to encourage, promote and fund social science research in the country.

The ICSSR is an autonomous body under the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India and a premier organisation with Six Regional Centres, 24 Research Institutes and Five Recognised Research Institutes located in different parts of the country.

The ICSSR's aims and objectives as spelt out in its Memorandum of Association are the following:

- Review and survey the progress of Social Science Research and advise the Government on policy issues;
- Fund and promote Social Science Research in Universities/Colleges/Research Institutes;
- Providing Doctoral (Ph.D.), Post-Doctoral, Senior and National Fellowships to researchers & faculties;
- Granting Minor, Major and Collaborative Research Projects to faculties;
- Funding seminars and conferences to disseminate social science research findings;
- Sponsoring training and capacity building programmes for young researchers and faculties;

- Providing international travel and data collection grant to scholars and faculties;
- Encouraging international collaboration in research with foreign countries and funding agencies;
- Funding publication of journals and books and strengthening professional social science associations/organizations;
- Providing library, documentation, data and online services for social science research; and
- Indicating periodic themes in neglected and new critical areas of research;

During the last forty-nine years of its establishment, the ICSSR has been actively promoting and funding social science research in the country. It provides regular maintenance and development grants to its Research Institutes on matching basis to study national and regional issues from multi-disciplinary perspectives. It also fully supports its six Regional Centres which represent the Council within their respective regions with a view to spread the programmes and schemes of the ICSSR. Under the international collaboration programme, ICSSR has signed bilateral collaborative agreements with ten countries including U.K., Netherlands, Switzerland, Germany, Vietnam, Sri Lanka, Japan, South Africa, Sweden, Bosnia and Herzegovina and cultural exchange programmes with three countries, namely, France, China and Thailand to engage in activities such as exchange of scholars, joint seminars, research projects, publications, exchange of books and periodicals etc. The ICSSR also participates in the activities of the international social science organizations like International Federation of Social Science Organisations (Quezon City, Philippines), International Social Science Council (Paris, France), Association of Asian

Social Science Research Councils (Canberra, Australia), Science Council of Asia (Tokyo, Japan) etc. as their important member.

Since its inception, the ICSSR has awarded/funded 6348 Major, Minor and Collaborative Research Projects, 7538 Doctoral (5515 Full-Term and 2023 Short-Term) Fellowships, 2081 Post-Doctoral Fellowships, 701 Senior Fellowships and 163 National Fellowships, 3682 National and 945 International Seminars, 1794 scholars for attending seminars abroad and 414 scholars for data collection abroad, 958 scholars under exchange of scholars and 92 Joint Research Projects under International Collaborative Programme, 890 Training & Capacity Building Programmes for young faculties and researchers, 1816 scholars for publication of their Doctoral Theses/ Projects/ Fellowship Reports/ Conference Proceedings etc., 943 Journals to keep publishing social science research papers or articles, and 362 professional associations for the maintenance and development of their research activities, conducted six round of surveys of current state of research in social science disciplines, namely, Economics, Political Science, Sociology and Social Anthropology, Geography, and Psychology in the country. The ICSSR is known for having published two very important social science research journals- '*The Indian Social Science Review*' and '*ICSSR Journals of Abstracts and Reviews*'. Apart from this, the ICSSR provides research services like library, documentation, data and e-resources to thousands of social science scholars across the country through its National Social Science Documentation Centre (NASSDOC).

Moreover, the ICSSR has been offering its research-based input/advice, whenever needed, to the Government of India on matters pertaining to policy relevant issues and has contributed in the Newton-Vivekanand programme with the UK (2016), the establishment of the Jai Prakash Narayan

Centre for Excellence in Humanities in Madhya Pradesh (2014), Ambedkar University of Social Sciences at Mhow, Madhya Pradesh etc. It has also carried out studies, whenever required, for various Ministries of Government of India including Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Ministry of Minority Affairs, Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), and the Ministry of Science and Technology. In addition, there is considerable presence of ICSSR studies and references in various policy documents and reports of the Ministries, and the Planning Commission (erstwhile). Moreover, the Member Secretary and Officers of ICSSR have regularly participated and contributed to the deliberations of other government organisations such as the University Grants Commission, Indian Statistical Institute, Indian Council of World Affairs, Indian Institute of Advanced Study, Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation etc.

As the ICSSR is about to complete 50 years of its existence, it faces significant challenges alongside opportunities for giving direction to social science research in India and abroad. According to a University Grants Commission Report (November 2018), there are 882 Universities in the country (48 Central Universities, 392 State Universities, 317 Private Universities and 125 Deemed to be Universities). Similarly, as per the data drawn from International Standard Series Number (ISSN) and Ulrich International Periodical Directory (UPID) data books, there were 2131 social science journals published in India during the year 2000-2015. The ICSSR Review Report (2007) mentions that while the scale and range of social science research in the country have been expanding, the quality of research output of a majority of institutions as well as their contribution to a better understanding of socio-economic processes and shaping public policy are perceived to have fallen short of expectations. The quality also needs to be improved considering that the precious

resources are being spent. The research quality constitutes a major challenge for all spheres of researches in the country, including social sciences.

Moreover, with the introduction of National Institutional Ranking Framework in 2015, research has come into greater focus as the rankings most importantly depend on research orientation and related output of the institutes or universities. The entire issue has raised the concerns of the policy makers to have a close look at the global peers and learn from each other the method of improving the research quality and culture to improve the rankings of Indian institutes or universities at the global level. Thus, all funding agencies like ICSSR face this crucial challenge of promoting advanced, novel and cutting edge researches to help institutes and universities in improving their national and global ranking, and also build a robust research culture in the country.

There are many opportunities that place the ICSSR in an advantageous position to play a leading role in social science research both in India as well as abroad. The 21st century is widely said to belong to Asia where Japan, India and China are perceived as major actors of which India and China having been emerging at a rapid rate in last three decades. The end of the Cold War and the growing impact of globalisation also required India to redefine its position and role both at the regional and at the global level. Since the economic liberalisation of the 1990s, India's global presence has been steadily rising. Among major countries India is now the fastest growing economy and world's sixth largest economy after the United States, China, Japan, Germany and United Kingdom. By 2050, it is projected to be among the largest three economies of the world. There are many issues that constitute common research concerns of the world, and at the same time there are country and policy specific research concerns that nations are interested in getting

well probed with a view to notice the facts of the existing problems and their possible solutions. Population, security, development pattern, inclusiveness, inequalities, sustainability, migration, urban infrastructure etc. could be some of such country specific concerns. Sometimes these country specific concerns may be shared by some other countries as well. India's aspiration to become one of the global leaders in knowledge creation rests on its research capabilities and infrastructure. Since researches ultimately have to and must serve the society and should contribute towards policy formulation and assessment; and the modern researches are crossing the tight compartments of disciplines and moving towards inter and multi disciplinarity where many disciplines combine their resources to achieve the common objective of larger welfare. In this respect, ICSSR's role acquires a greater significance. Even developments in science and technology require a social science perspective for greater acceptability of such developments by the society.

Now since India is viewed as a performing country, its research output is expected to have a larger share in global quality researches. New researches are leading to many paradigm shifts and are challenging colonial concepts and theories. In India also now there is increased emphasis on analysing our own problems while considering our socio-political and economic conditions in place of seeing these through seeing these through unquestioned Western prism. Application of local and country specific views and alternatives would definitely have a better capacity to solve our own problems and suggest alternatives which can be easily absorbed in our kind of ecosystem.

ICSSR has been aspiring to give a big push to social science research in India with the help of the government.

Greatly conscious of its new role, the ICSSR has undertaken some vital steps in this regard. Now it is focusing on both quantitative expansion of its programmes and schemes and also on the delivery of quality research output. During the year 2017-18, the ICSSR has provided financial assistance to several hundred scholars, faculties and research organisations to encourage and promote quality social science research in the country as given in Table No. 1.1.

Organisational Structure: The ICSSR's highest decision making body, known as the Council has 26 members, which includes the ICSSR Chairman and Member-Secretary, 18 social scientists and 6 ex-officio members representing the Government of India. The list containing members of the Governing Council is given at Appendix – 1.

The Member Secretary heads the ICSSR Secretariat consisting of Directors, Deputy Directors, Assistant Directors and other officials. The ICSSR's official staffs, apart from their normal official duties, have contributed research papers in journals, edited books, magazines etc. and have also delivered lectures during the reporting year.

The Council has three standing committees namely Research Committee (RC), Research Institutes Committee (RIC) and Planning and Administration Committee (PAC) comprising members drawn from inside and outside the Council (not more than three). During the financial year 2017-18, the Council had three meetings (135th A & B and 136th meetings held on 17th & 18th August 2017 and 22nd December 2017 respectively), the RC had two meetings (168th and 169th meetings held on 17th August 2017 and 21st December 2017 respectively), the RIC had two meetings (69th and 70th meetings held on 18th August 2017 and 21st

December 2017 respectively) and the PAC had two meetings (80th and 81st meetings held on 17th August 2017 and 21st December 2017 respectively).

This is the 49th Annual Report of the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR) that covers the Council's activities from 1st April, 2017 to 31st March, 2018.

Research Promotion

Promotion of research in social sciences is the most important activity of the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR). The ICSSR has been doing this through its various programmes and schemes such as funding Minor, Major & Collaborative Research Projects of faculties; providing Doctoral, Post-doctoral, Senior, and National Fellowships to scholars and faculties; awarding seminar and conference grants to disseminate social science research findings; sponsoring training and capacity building programmes for young researchers and faculties; providing international travel and data collection grants to scholars and faculties; encouraging international collaborations in research with country level funding agencies abroad; funding publication of journals and books, and strengthening professional social science associations/organizations through infrastructural grants; providing library, documentation, data and online literature services to social science researchers etc.

The ICSSR has identified the following broad disciplines of study, within the domain of social sciences:

- a) Economics
- b) Sociology, and Social Anthropology
- c) Political Science / Public Administration
- d) International Studies
- e) Social Geography, and Population Studies
- f) Commerce and Management
- g) Social Psychology
- h) Education
- i) Social Linguistics / Socio-Cultural Studies
- j) Law / International Law
- k) National Security & Strategic Studies
- l) Other allied Social Science disciplines such as Library Science, Social Work, Media Studies, Modern Social History, Health Studies, Gender Studies, Environmental Studies, Diaspora Studies, Area Studies, Sanskrit-Society & Cultural Studies, etc. to promote inter-disciplinary and multidisciplinary research.

Research Projects

Research Projects, both individual and institutional, are an important way to promote social science research in the country. The research projects may belong to any of the social science disciplines or may be multi-disciplinary in nature. The specific objectives of the programme are: a) to support high quality independent programme of research; b) to provide opportunities for training of future researchers; c) to contribute to the development of new theoretical or methodological approaches to research; d) to maintain and sustain various disciplinary research activities; e) to foster and promote collaborative, inter-disciplinary and multi-disciplinary research activities among researchers in social science; and f) to facilitate communication of research outputs both within and the academic community and also to provide key inputs to policy makers.

The ICSSR awards two types of Research Projects to Indian scholars: (a) Major and Minor Research Projects earlier known as Research Projects (Responsive) (b) Research Programmes previously known as Research Projects (Sponsored).

Major and Minor Research Projects

Major and Minor Projects are basically demand-driven. Under this scheme, the ICSSR provides grant to scholars to conduct research on the topics of their choice. The call for Research Projects (Major and Minor) for the year 2017-18 was given in August, 2017 and the Research Project Division received a total of 2862 applications. The proposals were first scrutinized by the ICSSR secretariat as per the eligibility criteria, and finally 356 scholars in total were recommended for Research Projects (Major-216 and Minor-140) on a wide range of themes/issues by the Expert Committee. This

included 63 Scheduled Caste and 27 Schedule Tribe scholars as well. Of the 216 Major Research Project awardees, 69 (32%) scholars are women, and of the 140 Minor project awardees, 48 were women (34%). The final reports of 266 research projects sanctioned in earlier years were received during the reporting year. The details of Research Projects sanctioned and final project reports received have been given in Appendix-3.

During the year 2017-18, the total expenditure for Major and Minor Projects was ₹1450.85 lakh. The year-wise position of research projects sanctioned since inception and reports received till 31st March, 2018 is furnished in Table 2.1.

Research Programmes

Research Programmes are a series of research studies undertaken simultaneously or sequentially on themes of significance and

priority in policy and Social Science Research. These studies, identified by the ICSSR from time to time, are expected to be inter-disciplinary or multi-disciplinary or inter-institutional in nature for critical understanding of new social science research issues and develop deeper understanding in terms of theory, methodology, new findings and policy outcomes. However, high impact studies which are extensive in structure but fall within the ambit of a single discipline are also considered.

The call for Research Programme for the year 2017-18 was given on 9th February, 2018. The Division received 420 applications. Out of this, 203 applications were found eligible as per the eligibility criteria prescribed in the guidelines. In addition, the Division also considered applications received under the 'Research Studies on Specific Issues in Special Regions', a separate scheme sponsored by the Government of India. Finally, 73 research studies were sanctioned by the ICSSR under

the Research Programme. This included four Scheduled Caste, one Scheduled Tribe and 20 female scholars. In addition, 14 studies have been awarded under the Special Scheme. The final reports of 35 sponsored research projects sanctioned in the previous years were received during the reporting year. Out of this, 14 belong to SC category and five to ST category. During the year 2017-18, the total expenditure for Research Programme was ₹709.31 lakh.

The Research Programme Scheme or Research Projects (Sponsored) Scheme was launched in 2011-12 with All India Report on Educational Status of Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes, and De-notified Tribes (DNT) for various states.

The details of Research Programmes sanctioned and final project reports received during the year have been given in Appendix-3. Year-wise position of research programmes sanctioned since 2011-12, projects cancelled/withdrawn/closed and reports received till 31st March, 2018 is given in Table 2.2.

Research Fellowships

In order to provide research opportunities to young, senior and established social scientists and to engage them in full-time research on important themes of their choice, four categories of fellowships, namely, National Fellowship, Senior Fellowship, Post-doctoral Fellowship, and Doctoral Fellowship are offered to scholars who are at various levels in their profession.

National Fellowships

'National Fellowships' are awarded to eminent Indian social scientists in recognition to their scholarly contributions, and for providing opportunities to engage them in full-time researches that have the potential to contribute in advancement of knowledge in social science disciplines. The ICSSR has so far awarded 163 National Fellowships. The relevant details are given below in Table 2.3.

Senior Fellowships

Senior Fellowships are awarded to outstanding Indian social scientists for conducting full time research on themes and issues of national importance and social concerns as proposed by the applicants. These studies are expected to contribute to theoretical and conceptual advancement in different disciplines, help to generate field work based empirical data and contribute as important inputs for policy making. The ICSSR has so far awarded 701 Senior Fellowships. During the reporting year, 36 senior fellowships were awarded. The relevant details are given in Table 2.4 and Appendix-4.

Post-doctoral Fellowships

The main objective of ICSSR Post-doctoral Fellowship is to encourage young Indian social science scholars who have completed their doctoral research and wish to pursue a career in higher education teaching and research. They should have a high potential and promise for

conducting full time research on specific themes and issues. The ICSSR has so far awarded 2081 Post-doctoral Fellowships. During the year 2017-18, 226 Post-doctoral Fellowships were awarded. The details of Senior and Post-doctoral Fellowship sanctioned during the year have been given in Appendix-4. During 2017-18, the total expenditure for National/Senior/Post-doctoral Fellowship schemes was ₹2365.83 lakh.

The year-wise details of Post-doctoral Fellowship are given in Table 2.5

The ICSSR has taken a number of steps to deal with the pending research reports from the scholars under different fellowship schemes and projects. These steps include revision of guidelines to ensure timely submission of research reports and writing letters/emails to scholars, their supervisors and heads

of affiliating institutions. Those who have expressed their commitment to submit the reports without further delay, they have been given the last opportunity (as requested) to submit the report at the earliest (year-end). In other cases, rules provide them to surrender the grant availed with required interest. Many heads of institutions such as Vice Chancellors, Directors of institutes/ Principals etc. have responded to these measures of the ICSSR and have assured to get these reports submitted within the last extended time limit. As a result the flow of report submission has shown an encouraging trend and pendency is declining.

Doctoral Fellowship

The ICSSR provides financial assistance to registered Ph.D. scholars to pursue and complete their doctoral degrees in social science disciplines. The main aim is to provide financial support to young scholars to enable them to focus on full time doctoral research work and bring out quality research output through their Ph.D. theses and publications.

The ICSSR has two schemes of doctoral fellowship, one known as, 'Centrally Administered Doctoral Fellowship' and the other as 'Institutional Doctoral Fellowship' meant for ICSSR sponsored Research Institutes. The call for Centrally Administered Doctoral Fellowship is given by the ICSSR and it also processes the applications for final awards and monitors these fellowships itself.

Within Centrally Administered Doctoral Fellowship, there are three types which are as follows:

1. Full-term Doctoral Fellowships are awarded for a period of two years to the candidates, who have confirmed Ph.D. registration in a Indian university/ institute.
2. Short-term Doctoral Fellowships are awarded for a period of six months to support scholars during the final stages of their doctoral work.
3. Contingency Grant is a one-time grant awarded to a Ph. D. scholars who are about to submit doctoral thesis for evaluation. It may be utilised for data processing & analysis, typing, binding, hiring of expert services etc.

The call for Institutional Doctoral Fellowships (Full-term) is given by the ICSSR research institutes and after preliminary screening at the level of institutes, these are sent to ICSSR for the opinion of its experts. Thereafter, these fellowships are monitored by the research institutes at their level.

Centrally Administered Doctoral Fellowships

The applications for Full-term/Short-term Doctoral Fellowships for the year 2017-18 were invited in the first week of August, 2017 and the 'Research Fellowship Division' received a total of 2,125 applications, out of which 2057 were for Full-term fellowships, 65 applications for

short-term fellowships, and three applications for contingency grant. After careful scrutiny of applications by the Screening Committee, 1891 eligible applications were evaluated by the Expert Committees. The Committees finally recommended 420 for Full-term Fellowship that included 324 General, 63 Schedule Caste & 33 Schedule Tribe candidates.

In addition, 43 applicants were selected for Short-term Fellowships and three for Contingency Grant. The total expenditure involved was ₹1731.23 lakh. Further details may be seen in Appendix-4.

Institutional Doctoral Fellowships

In the year 2017-18, 64 Institutional Doctoral Fellowships were awarded through 11

ICSSR research institutes (grant-in-aid and recognized) in the disciplines/areas in which the institutes are said to have specialized faculty as laid down under guidelines). The detailed distribution of 64 Institutional Fellowships is given in Table 2.6.

Thus, in all, ICSSR awarded a total of 484 Full-term Doctoral Fellowships in the year 2017-18.

Status of Full-term Doctoral Fellowships

The Doctoral Fellowships scheme was first implemented in the year 1971-72 with the award of 10 fellowships. The 'Institutional Doctoral Fellowship Scheme' was started in the year 1975-76 while earmarking six fellowships to five research institutes. The number of ICSSR Doctoral fellowships have gradually increased

over a period of time, reaching 483 in 2012. The year-wise details of Doctoral Fellowships awarded, withdrawals and theses submitted over these years may be seen in the Table 2.7.

National and International Seminars

Sponsoring seminars/conferences in India is one of the major activities of ICSSR to promote issues of concern in social science research. They provide opportunities to researchers and academicians to exchange views and researches, discuss important research questions on policy relevant issues, and generate academic research reports on important social problems. While the Council itself organises a few seminars, most of its support is responsive in nature

where partial financial assistance is provided to academic institutions for organising national and international seminars in all social science disciplines.

During 2017-18, the ICSSR received over 800 proposals for organizing international/national seminars from all across India out of which 304 proposals were selected for funding by the Expert Committee. This included 87 international and 217 national seminar proposals involving a total expenditure of ₹577.53 lakh. The lists of seminars approved may be seen at Appendix-5.

Further year-wise details about the seminars funded by the ICSSR since its inception may be seen in Table No. 2.8.

Training and Capacity Building Programme

A basic requirement for high quality research in Social Science is the training in the science and art of doing research. While the philosophical basis of Social Science research is common to all disciplines of social science, different subjects have evolved their own theoretical frameworks and discipline specific techniques of research. However, scholars engaging themselves in inter-disciplinary or multi-disciplinary research need to familiarize themselves with the research methodologies of the disciplines other than their own in which they are trained. Moreover, from the stage of identification of research problem to methodology and finally reporting and analysis of findings, and also publication of these findings, there are several aspects in which a good researcher has to refine his/her skills. Therefore, the ICSSR supports and sponsors 'Research Methodology and Capacity Building Programmes' in universities and Research Institutes.

The ICSSR provides grants to the social science faculties for organizing 'Research Methodology and Capacity Building Programmes' for young researchers and faculties in various social

science disciplines, which may include multi-disciplinary perspectives and training. The Programme is divided into the following two categories:

(A) Research Methodology Course (RMC)

The aim of the course is to enhance the methodological and writing skills of the PDF/Ph.D/M. Phil. scholars and develop their potential as future faculties/social science researchers.

(B) Capacity Building Programme (CBP)

The aim of this programme is to give an exposure to the young Assistant Professors in Social Science disciplines to the latest advances in their subjects, and also to improve their capacity in methodological understanding as well as writing skills.

Since 1971 when the programme was first conceptualised and till 2017-18, 890 Research Methodology, and Capacity Building Programmes have been funded by the ICSSR. During the year under report, a total of 219 proposals for both Research Methodology Course and Capacity Building Programme

were received and placed before the Expert Committees for evaluation. The Committees approved 52 proposals, 29 under Research Methodology Course (6 Schedule Caste and 3 Schedule Tribe) and 23 under Capacity Building Programme (6 Schedule Caste and 3 Schedule Tribe) with a total expenditure of ₹ 277.76 Lakh. Later, however, 3 proposals were withdrawn by the Course Directors due to administrative reasons at the level of their institutions. Information about the Research Methodology Course and Training & Capacity Building is given in Table No 2.9. The lists of Methodology and Capacity Building Courses approved may also be seen at Appendix-6.

Research Survey and Publications

Publication & Research Survey Programme is another major activity of the ICSSR through which it disseminates important research outputs produced both within and outside the Council. Under its publication scheme, the Council used to publish two research journals '*The Indian Social Science Review*' and '*ICSSR Journals of Abstracts and Reviews*' (These were discontinued in 2009, but the Council has

decided to restart publishing the journals) to bring out important papers resulting from its own supported research and research related activities. Besides, the Council also provides grants to (a) Indian nationals for publication of their Doctoral Theses, Projects/Fellowships Reports, Monographs and Seminars/Workshop Proceedings in a field of social science (b) professional associations/ organisations of social scientists including universities, colleges and research institutes for publication/ running of their research journal(s) and (c) professional associations/organisation of social scientists for their maintenance and developmental activities.

During the reporting year, 28 Doctoral Theses and Research Reports were published with ICSSR grant with a total expenditure of ₹ 13.88 lakh. Similarly, 40 professional organizations/ associations of social scientists received ICSSR grant of ₹ 34.10 lakh for publication of their journals and three for their infrastructural development with an amount of Rs. 3.50 lakh. The lists of publication grant beneficiaries and professional associations/organisations received grant for their development may be

seen at Appendix-7. The year-wise information pertaining to the publication programme of the ICSSR is given in Table 2.10.

Moreover, the Council, since inception, has undertaken the task of surveying research developments in chosen disciplines of social science through its programme of surveys of research. The core objective of the surveys has been to have a comprehensive overview of research undertaken during a specified period, involving stock-taking of what has been achieved in the discipline in terms of theory, methodology, empirical evidence and gaps which need to be prioritised for future agenda. So far, the ICSSR has published around 70 Volumes of Research Surveys and 60 other publications.

The Council has undertaken the Sixth Round of ICSSR Research Survey in the disciplines of Psychology, Political Science, Geography, Sociology & Social Anthropology and Economics covering the period 2003-2009. The final Research Survey Report pertaining to Political Science, Geography, Economics

and Sociology and Social Anthropology have already been published and 'Psychology' is likely to be published in April 2019 by M/s Oxford University Press (OUP), New Delhi.

National Social Science Documentation Centre

Established in 1970, the National Social Science Documentation Centre (NASSDOC) is a constituent unit of ICSSR and provides library and information services to the social science research community including academic institutions, autonomous research organisations, policy making bodies, planning and research units of the government departments etc. In order to meet the challenges posed by technology driven world, it makes use of web based digital environment for creating, applying and utilizing information with its automated library collection, WEBOPAC, online databases/e-resources etc. Major activities and services of the NASSDOC include Library, Reference & Information Services, E-resources for ICSSR's Research Institutes

& Regional Centres, Compilation of Short Bibliographies / Literature Search Service, Microfilm & Microfiche Services, Continuing Education Programme, Value Added Services like Current Awareness Service (CAS), Professional Skill Development, National Knowledge Network internet facility to access e-resources in social sciences with the state of the art 'Digital Resources Learning Centre' (DRLC). In addition to this, the NASSDOC has a Sales and Distribution unit to supply in-house publications of the ICSSR.

Library, Reference and Information Services: NASSDOC has wide range of document collections (22,541) comprising of reference source collection like bibliographies, encyclopaedias, directories etc.; grey collection consisting of doctoral theses, research project reports; special collection on research methodology, research surveys and; strategic collection on all social science disciplines including library & information science, and computer & information technology and 12,600 bound volumes of journals. The library is open from 9:30 AM to 6:00 PM from Monday to Saturday and is closed on Sundays and all gazetted holidays.

A total number of 4128 research scholars visited NASSDOC during 2017-18. A large number of reference queries were attended through correspondence/ e-mail etc. Research related information was provided to scholars from NASSDOC's collection, its in-house databases and by exploring electronic sources and several other internet based resources.

ICSSR-NASSDOC library's membership is available for ICSSR officials, Consulting, ICSSR Beneficiaries, Borrowers, Institutes and Guests.

Inter-Library Loan: For providing books/ journals to scholars/ libraries, which are not available in NASSDOC, it gets them on loan

from other libraries. Similarly, books and journals are issued to other libraries. During the year, 123 books were issued to other libraries. NASSDOC is a member of DELNET (Developing Libraries Network). Its services are also used for inter-library loan.

E-Resources: Two computer terminals in the reading hall are specifically dedicated to the use of e-resources and online journals in the library. Nine online e-resources (all subscribed) and other digital resources were used by 352 scholars in NASSDOC premises for reference queries, for compilation of bibliographies and other services of NASSDOC.

Acquisition of Research Material: Books / Theses / Periodicals / E-resources- During the year, 704 documents have been added to the NASSDOC collection. It includes 443 books by purchase, 2 theses, 184 research reports and 75 books were received as gift in paper format. 102 journals (foreign and Indian) were subscribed, 110 periodicals were received through gratis, 14 daily newspapers and 12 popular magazines were also subscribed for the readers. Annual Reports of Ministries and Departments of Govt. of India and various institutes were also added to the collection of NASSDOC. Following e-resources were subscribed for NASSDOC: EconLit with Full Text (EBSCO), IndiaStat and its all other associate sites (Datanet India), J-Gate Social & Management Sciences Arts and Humanities, JSTOR (ITHAKA), LISTA with full text (Library, Information Science and Technology Abstracts), Political Science Complete (EBSCO), Prowess IQ (Centre for Monitoring Indian Economy), PsycArticles(ProQuest), SocIndex with Full Text (EBSCO) (Sociology), DELNET (Developing Library Network, gives access to 11 databases).

E-resources for ICSSR Research Institutes (RI) and Regional Centres (RC): In order to enhance

capacities of ICSSR's Research Institutes and Regional Centres for advancing knowledge in social science, NASSDOC subscribed following e-resources for them during 2017-18 provided in Table 2.11.

Compilation of Short Bibliographies/Literature Search Service: During the year 2017-18, 51 short and select bibliographies with abstracts (Appendix-8) were compiled and supplied to research scholars and ICSSR officers on the basis of demand received from them.

Microfilm & Microfiche Services: NASSDOC has a good collection (near about 3500) of microfilms & microfiches along with a microfilm reader facility.

Continuing Education Programme: In order to keep in touch with the latest developments and to develop specialised skills in accessing social science information, NASSDOC organises short-term training workshops/seminars/interactive sessions and lectures under its

'Continuing Education Programme' on regular basis.

Value Added Services: Current Awareness Service (CAS) is provided by bringing out different publications at regular quarterly intervals under "NASSDOC Research Information Series" namely (a). Social Science Conference Alert (b) New Arrivals: List of New Additions with Summaries (c) Current Contents.

Professional Skill Development and Networking: Educational Tour: NASSDOC is a part of curriculum of various Library and Information Science Schools of Indian universities and other educational institutions.

Membership of Professional Bodies: Annual membership was renewed to International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions (IFLA), The Hague, Netherlands, DELNET (Developing Library Network), Indian Library Association (ILA), New Delhi,

Indian Association of Special Libraries and Information Centres (IASLIC), Kolkata.

The total expenditure incurred by NASSDOC during 2017-18 was ₹ 144.74 lakh.

International Collaboration

Promoting social science research through international collaboration is one of the major strategies of the ICSSR. Under this programme, the Council provides opportunity to both Indian and foreign scholars to interact, learn, research and contribute to social science in India and abroad. The Council undertakes several important activities under the programme. They include: bilateral and multilateral collaborations with foreign funding councils/social science organisations, providing financial assistance to Indian scholars for presenting papers in international conferences/data collection abroad etc.

The ICSSR has established bilateral social science collaborative agreements with its counterparts abroad. Besides, the Council is one of the implementing agencies of the Government of India's Cultural Exchange Programme/ Educational Exchange Programme with other countries.

Bilateral Collaborative Programme

The ICSSR has signed 'Bilateral Collaborative Programmes' with parallel organisations of several countries to implement activities such as exchange of scholars, joint seminars, joint projects, joint publications, exchange of books and periodicals, etc. The Council also invites eminent foreign scholars to visit India for delivering lectures under its scheme of 'Visit of Distinguished Scholars'. The ICSSR has bilateral collaboration with the following organisations/countries.

Economic and Social Research Council (ESRC), UK

The ICSSR- Economic and Social Research Council (ESRC) have a bilateral collaboration programme since 1st April, 2008. The fresh MoU has been signed on 24th September, 2018 for a period of three years.

Japan Society for the Promotion of Science (JSPS), Tokyo, Japan

The ICSSR and JSPS signed an MoU commencing from 26th February, 2015 and will remain in force for a period of three years and thereafter it will be automatically extended for a further period of three years, unless either party gives notice of discontinuation not later than six months in advance.

National Institute for the Humanities and Social Sciences (NIHSS), South Africa

The ICSSR and the NIHSS, South Africa signed an MOU on 20th March, 2014 for a period of three years and renewable for another three years, unless either party terminates.

UNIL-ALH (University of Lausanne – Associated Leading House), Switzerland

The ICSSR and UNIL-ALH (University of Lausanne – Associated Leading House), Switzerland recognizing the need for collaborative programmes and activities by the two institutions in the fields of mutual interest as determined by their priorities and the comparative advantages and resources within the two Institutions signed the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on 14th February, 2012 for a period of three years, which has been extended till December 2017.

The Netherlands Scientific Organization (NWO), The Netherlands

The ICSSR, and the Netherlands Organization of Scientific Research (NWO), The Hague

(Netherlands) have signed a MoU in 2006 to collaborate in the field of social science to strengthen and promote social science research. It was extended in 2009 to operationalize the ongoing activities under this bilateral programme. The MoU has been further extended from time to time and current MoU was signed on 28th January, 2015 and was in force till 2017. Both the organizations have agreed to sign a fresh MoU after identification of new areas and activities.

National Science Foundation (NSF), Sri Lanka

The MoU between ICSSR and NSF was signed on 13th March 2014 for a period of three years, which is automatically extendable further for a period of three years with mutual consent. The extension is in process.

Vietnam Academy of Social Science (VASS), Vietnam

The MoU between ICSSR and VASS was signed on 4th May, 2010 for a period of three years and renewable for another three years, unless either party gives notice of termination. A fresh MoU between ICSSR and VASS has been signed on 8th March, 2017.

German Research Foundation (DFG), Germany

The ICSSR and the German Research Foundation (DFG -- Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft), Germany recognizing the importance of the mutual benefit to be derived from bilateral collaboration and with the desire to strengthen the research cooperation on the basis of equality between the researchers and academics from the universities and the research institutions in both the countries in the field of Humanities and Social Sciences signed an Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on 19th November, 2012. The Agreement shall remain valid for a period of five years and shall subsequently extend thereafter annually, unless a written

notice of termination is given by either organization six months in advance

Academy of Sciences and Arts of Bosnia and Herzegovina (ANUBiH)

The current MoU has been signed with the ANUBiH to develop a better understanding of Social Sciences and Humanities in India and in Bosnia and Herzegovina through collaborative research commencing on 30 September, 2015 (signed by ANUBiH on 03.09.2015 and by ICSSR on 30.09.2015) for a period of three years and renewable for another three years, unless either party gives notice of termination.

Swedish Research Council for Health, Working Life and Welfare (FORTE), Sweden

The MoU between ICSSR and FORTE, Sweden has been signed to be effective from 1st November, 2014 for a period of three years and renewable for another three years, unless either party gives notice of termination.

During the reporting year, the following activities were organised under the Bilateral Collaborative Programme of ICSSR:

ICSSR-ESRC (UK) Bilateral Programme

The ICSSR and the Economic & Social Research Council (ESRC), UK has a collaborative arrangement, acknowledging the importance of developing the premises of academic cooperation in the fields of Humanities and Social Science between the UK and Indian researchers, and promoting further development of the research communities of both countries through a MoU. ICSSR-ESRC invited the joint call for collaborative research project on 'Urban Transformation in India'. After going through the review process and as per the final recommendations of the Commissioning Panel, the following joint research projects have been sanctioned:

ICSSR-ESRC-RCUK Joint Seminar

Two-day Seminar on the theme “Policy for Higher Education and Researches” was held on 11 & 12th December, 2017 organized by ICSSR in collaboration with ESRC (UK) & RC (UK). This seminar was a part of the activities being undertaken within the framework of ICSSR-ESRC Bilateral Collaboration Programme. Nine Indian and eight UK scholars participated in the deliberation of the two day event.

ICSSR-JSPS (Japan) Bilateral Programme

The ICSSR and JSPS, acknowledging the importance of developing the premises of academic cooperation in the fields of humanities and social science between the Japanese and Indian researchers, and wishing to promote further development of the research communities of both countries signed the MoU. The major activities under the programme are: (1) Joint Research Projects; (2) Joint Seminars; and (3) Other cooperative activities as may be mutually decided upon. The ICSSR has given a call for joint research projects and joint seminars inviting Indian scholars to explore research under ‘India-Japan

Collaboration’ in the field of social science research. Against the Joint Call, the ICSSR received the applications, after going through the review process. The details of joint research projects and seminar have been given in Table 2.14 and 2.15 respectively.

ICSSR-UNIL-ALH (Switzerland) Joint Research Project

The ICSSR and UNIL-ALH (University of Lausanne-Associated Leading House), Switzerland, recognizing the need for collaborative programme and activities by the two institutions in the fields of mutual interest as determined by their priorities and the comparative advantages and resources within the two institutions, signed the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU). The second call was given in 2016 for Scholar Exchange Grants (SEG). Under the call it is designed to fund visits of researchers in the social science between Switzerland and India, for joint research, field research, teaching exchange, joint development of a research proposal, and presentations in conferences. After going through the review

The ICSSR-UNIL-ALH (Switzerland) 4th joint seminar was held on 04-06 September 2017 in Basel (Switzerland) under 'ICSSR-UNIL Bilateral Programme'. 14 Indian and 19 Swiss scholars participated in the deliberation of the three day event.

Cultural Exchange Programme (CEP)

The ICSSR not only sponsors Indian social scientists to visit other countries but also entertains foreign scholars under the Exchange Programmes. The purpose of such visits is to enable social scientists to collect research material, deliver lectures, participate in seminars, consult libraries and interact with social scientists. The ICSSR is presently

having cultural exchange programme with the following organisations.

**Maison Des Sciences de L’Homme (MSH),
France,**

The ICSSR is the implementing agency of the social science aspects for the ‘India- France Cultural Exchange Programme’ since mid-1970s.

The ICSSR and MSH, Paris are actively implementing the programme in the field of social science within the framework of the Cultural Exchange Programme/ Employee Exchange Programme between the Government of India and Government of France since 15th February, 2007 for a period of three years, unless either side issued a six months’ written notice of its intention to amend or terminate it.

**Chinese Academy of Social Sciences (CASS),
China**

Since 1985, the ICSSR and the Chinese Academy of Social Science (CASS), Beijing, China have been actively involved in collaborating by signing a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) within the framework of India-China Cultural Agreement signed by the two Governments.

The current MOU between ICSSR and CASS was signed on 3rd September, 2009 for a period of three years. Thereafter, it was automatically extended for further periods of three years at a time, unless either side issues a six months’ written notice of its intention to amend or terminate it.

Under the scholars exchange programme, one scholar from China visited India for her research work.

The ICSSR has collaborative relations with National Research Council Thailand (NRCT), Bangkok in the field of social sciences under the framework of ICSSR-NRCT Bilateral Programme, which includes exchange of scholars and joint seminars/publications. MOU is based on the continual framework of the Educational Exchange Programme signed between India and Thailand on 11th September, 2006. The current MoU with NRCT was signed in August, 2013 for a duration of three years and is automatically renewable for another three years. The 12th ICSSR-NRCT joint seminar on “India- Thailand: Commerce, Connectivity and Culture” and ICSSR-NRCT 13th Joint Advisory Committee meeting held on 19th to 20th February, 2018 in Bodh Gaya (Bihar). 20 Thai and 13 Indian scholars participated in the two day event.

Membership of International Organisations

The ICSSR is a member organization of eminent international research bodies such as International Social Science Council (ISSC) now renamed as International Science Council (ISC), and Science Council of Asia (SCA). The Council has been identified as the nodal agency for participating in the activities of the UNESCO’s MOST (Management of Social Transformation) programme and its implementation.

The ISC is a membership-based organisation governed by a General Assembly and an elected Executive Committee. The ISC members

include international professional associations and unions, regional and national social science research councils and academies, universities and institutes with major interests in the social sciences. The Secretariat of ISC is in Paris and manages a dynamic portfolio of programmes and activities aimed at strengthening the social sciences to help solve global priority problems and secure a sustainable future for everyone.

The Science Council of Asia (SCA) is a regional organization of Asia established in May 2000. SCA has been working to strengthen the cooperation between scientists and facilitate interactions with policymakers in keeping with its role of providing a multi-functional platform of networking for effective partnerships among the countries in Asia. SCA has constantly reviewed its management and activities in order to maximise its scientific and social influence. The ICSSR actively and regularly participates in various SCA Annual Meetings and Annual Conferences which helps the Council in aligning its priorities with other member countries. The ICSSR, however, could not take part in the 17th SCA Conference held during 14 to 16 June 2017 at Manila in Philippines.

The 39th Session of the General Conference of UNESCO on Social and Human Sciences Commission was attended by the Hon’ble Chairman and the Member Secretary, ICSSR, which was held in Paris, France from 30th October to 14th November, 2017. The ICSSR emphasized that meetings of the Sub-commission on Social Sciences may be held regularly with a purpose to define future areas, priorities and the plan of action in respect of UNESCO to have greater impact.

International Travel Grant for Paper Presentation/ Data Collection Abroad

The aim of this programme is to assist invited social science scholars to make substantial

contributions to important international seminars/conferences. By doing this, it promotes academic links amongst the social scientists in India and abroad, provides opportunity to develop new insights and thus, to enlarge their research perspective(s) and contribute to the advancement and dissemination of knowledge in social science subjects.

In pursuance of its policy to permit closer contacts between India and overseas social scientists, the ICSSR has developed two programmes. Under the first, financial assistance is provided to Indian scholars, who have been invited to contribute and present a paper at international conferences abroad. Secondly, ICSSR also provides financial assistance to scholars who intend to visit abroad for the purposes of data collection or consulting archival material in connection with their research work.

During 2017-18, 78 scholars availed travel grant for participation in international conferences & data collection abroad (Appendix-9). The International Collaboration programme has

spent a total of ₹ 266.97 lakh for all its activities during the year 2017-18.

Regional Centres

The Regional Centres were established as part of the Council's programme of decentralising administration, broad basing social science research, and involving social science institutions in the region in promoting social science research. Their main roles were defined as follows:

- Represent the ICSSR within the region and spread the programmes of the ICSSR to social scientists in the region;
- Bring the ideas and concerns of the social scientists of the region to the notice of the ICSSR for possible action;
- Bring the social scientists of the region closer for promoting research within the region; and
- Serve as a link between the social scientists of the region and the national

and international community of social scientists.

Activities

- Promoting documentation and bibliographical work in the regional languages;
- Organizing/ funding seminars/workshops/conferences in the region;
- Organizing lectures by distinguished scholars;
- Supporting regional professional associations of social scientists and social science journals in the regional languages;
- Facilitating scholars in field works;
- Awarding study grant to scholars for visiting libraries and institutions for academic work;
- Making available journals and relevant papers to scholars, and
- Any other activity that may promote social science research in the region and/or any other research activity to be carried out by the region.

Regional Centres have developed infrastructure and research support facilities over the years with the support provided by the ICSSR and the host institute. These include hostel/guest house facilities, library space, conference halls, seminar rooms' reprographic facilities etc.

Regional Centres- Year at a Glance

The ICSSR has six Regional Centres. Their location, coverage and research activities are as follows:

Eastern Regional Centre (ERC), Kolkata was established in 1972 and caters to the social

science research needs of Bihar, Odisha, West Bengal, Jharkhand and the Union Territory of Andaman and Nicobar Islands. It is located in Kolkata, West Bengal and is the national Centre to provide social science material to scholars in Bengali and Odiya. The Centre-enriched its library by renewing 66 Indian and 7 foreign journals during the year 2017-18. The Centre also funded 21 seminars/conferences/workshops. Five research projects have been completed and seven research projects are ongoing. The link to website of the Centre is <http://www.ercicssr.org>

Northern Regional Centre (NRC), New Delhi was established in 1975 and looks after the social science research needs of Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and Delhi. It is situated at Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi and acts as a national Centre to provide social science material to scholars in Hindi and English. In the year 2017-18, the Centre funded 30 seminars/conferences/workshops and provided study grant to two scholars. Six research projects have also been completed and nine research projects are ongoing. The link to website of the Centre is www.nrc-icssr.org

North-Eastern Regional Centre (NERC), Shillong was established in 1977 and caters to the research needs of Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Tripura and Sikkim. It is situated at North-Eastern Hill University (NEHU) Campus, Shillong, Meghalaya. In the reporting year, the Centre funded 62 seminars/workshops/conferences, awarded study grant to five scholars and sanctioned contingency grants to 18 scholars. One research project has also been completed and nine are ongoing. The Centre publishes one Journal and organized two lectures during the period under report. North-Western Regional Centre (NWRC), Chandigarh was established in 1977 and looks after the research needs of Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Punjab, and the Union Territory of Chandigarh. It is located at Panjab University Chandigarh. It provided financial support to 36 workshops/seminars/conferences and study grants to six scholars during 2017-18. It also organized two research methodology courses and six lectures. Two research projects have been completed and three are ongoing. Southern Regional Centre (SRC), Hyderabad was established in 1972 and caters to the social science research needs of Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Karnataka, Kerala, Tamil Nadu and the Union Territories of Lakshadweep and Puducherry. It is situated at Osmania University Campus, Hyderabad. It financially supported 46 seminars/workshops/conferences during 2017-18 and organised 13

Research Institutes

ICSSR has been supporting Research Institutes which are outside the scope of University Grants Commission (UGC) and has been providing them grant for research activities, establishments, infrastructure, and maintenance etc., for the purpose of enlarging the base of social science knowledge, improving the quality of research, and promoting an inter-disciplinary perspective. The Indian Council of Social Science Research provides maintenance and development grant to 24 Research Institutes that constitute an important mechanism for implementing the Council's policy of dispersal of research talents and building up of research capabilities in the different regions of the country, particularly in the areas where social science research is not yet well developed.

The Research Institutes have established close links with the scholars in the region as well as elsewhere through various activities such as seminars, workshops, training and consultancy programmes. Some of the institutes are closely associated with national and state level planning and development agencies, and have thereby strengthened the links between research and policy making.

Each Institute determines its own direction of research, which includes a wide spectrum of subjects. Taken together, they have generated substantial empirical knowledge of the structure of Indian economy, polity and society and their dynamics both at the national and regional levels. A total of 236 projects were completed and 363 were ongoing studies by the research institutes during the year under report.

Research institutes disseminate the results of their research studies in the form of published books, mimeographs, working/occasional papers, etc. During the year under report,

the research institutes published 135 books/reports, 100 monographs/mimeographs, 168 working/occasional papers and 530 research papers.

The institutes also undertake training of young social scientists and assist fresh researchers in designing and conducting their research. To this end, doctoral fellowships have been provided to these institutes. Some of the institutes have been assisting in teaching and training programmes for M.Phil. and Ph.D. students. In addition, as per the Council's policy, some of these participate in postgraduate teaching, research guidance in the universities and also involve the university teachers in their research programmes. During the year, 491 scholars were working under the guidance of the faculties of the research institutes, 37 were awarded Ph.D. degrees and 37 scholars submitted their doctoral theses. A total of 550 seminars and workshops were held during 2017-18.

Research Institutes: A Profile

The focus and activities of the Research Institutes during the reporting year are presented below:

The focus of the *A.N. Sinha Institute of Social Studies (ANSISS)*, Patna was on development with particular reference to problems of Bihar and the Eastern Region. Its approach to development emphasizes on community initiative. A number of studies related to proposed land acquisitions under various projects in separate districts of Bihar, ethnographic studies, malnutrition among women & children and socio-economic development in selected districts of Bihar have been undertaken by the Institute. During 2017-18, 13 projects/studies were completed, 22 were in progress and eight new projects were initiated. Apart from bringing out 10 research articles by the faculty, the institute

also organized eight seminars/ workshops/ conferences.

The research activities of the *Centre for Development Studies (CDS), Thiruvananthapuram* during the year were focused on role of women in local governance, trade network of Asia and Pacific tea producers, aging survey in Kerala, and infant and child mortality in India etc. Four studies were completed while work on 11 studies was in progress. Five new projects were initiated. Six students were awarded Ph.D., five theses were submitted and 33 scholars were working for their Ph.D. degrees. Five books, 39 research articles, 18 monographs and 10 working papers were brought out by the faculty. Similarly, 41 seminars/conferences/lectures/workshops were also organized by the Centre.

The research activities of the *Centre for Economic and Social Studies (CESS), Hyderabad* revolved around cotton production by small-holders in Andhra Pradesh, productivity growth in manufacturing sector, socio-economic impact of groundwater exploration and management in selected districts of Telangana, urban housing rights advocacy, working and living conditions of sewerage workers, and socio-economic conditions of SCs/STs and the gaps in development in Telangana and Andhra Pradesh etc. The Centre completed 17 research projects; and 24 studies/projects are in progress. The faculty published one book, one monograph/mimeographs, 9 book chapters, 12 research papers and 12 working papers. Three scholars submitted their Ph.D. theses, and 88 scholars are pursuing research. A total of 15 seminars/conferences/workshops were organized during the year by the institute.

The main activities of the *Centre for Multi-Disciplinary Development Research (CMDR), Dharwad* were centered on crop insurance in Karnataka and social sector development in India. During the period under review, the institute completed two research projects

and 13 projects were at various stages of completion. Two scholars were pursuing their Ph.D. works. The Centre organized 17 seminars/conferences/lectures. The faculty published three books, 14 monographs, and 11 research papers.

The focus of studies of the *Centre for Policy Research (CPR), New Delhi* has been on smaller states for promoting inclusive development, informal settlements in Delhi, India's middle class, urban transformation in India, public transport and transport regulation, and research on migration in Indian context etc. During the year, the Centre completed eight projects and nine projects are at various stages of completion. The faculty published six books, 16 research papers and 35 working/ occasional papers. The Centre also organized 97 seminars/workshops/conferences during the year.

The *Centre for Research in Rural and Industrial Development (CRRID), Chandigarh* conducted research on training need assessment, development of training modules and evaluation of training programmes of PRIs in Punjab, farmer producer organizations & agri-marketing, development plan for Gram Panchayats, diversification of agriculture in Haryana, assessments of the assets constructed under MGNREGA, documentation of best practices on rural sanitation and waste management, monitoring of rural development programmes in selected districts of Rajasthan, village development plans, assessment of National Health Mission Programmes (NHM), public health, and status of industrial development etc. During the year, the Centre completed 33 projects and 15 projects are at various stages of completion. In addition, the Centre organized 20 seminars/conferences/workshops and training programmes. Two books and 27 research papers were published by the faculty in various journals and edited books. 16 scholars were also pursuing their Ph.D. at the centre.

Research activities of the *Centre for Social Studies (CSS)*, Surat are related to the intensity of capital and labour use in unorganized sector, and working and living conditions of sugarcane harvesters of South Gujarat. During the period, two projects were completed and six are in progress. The faculty members published six research papers in various journals and organized two seminars/conferences/training programmes.

The *Centre for Studies in Social Sciences (CSSS)*, Kolkata concentrated its work on text and images of early modern Bengal in public and private collections in Shantipur and its neighborhood, and state of capital market and household saving etc. During the year, three projects were completed and five are in progress. The Centre published 54 research articles. During the period, 41 workshops / lectures/ seminars were organized. Seven scholars submitted theses and 72 are pursuing their Ph.D.

The main focus of research at the *Centre for the Study of Developing Societies (CSDS)*, Delhi has been on election related studies and ethnography studies. During the year, five projects were completed and 27 studies were in progress. The Centre published five books and 31 research papers in various journals. The Centre also organized 53 seminars/conferences/lectures. Two scholars were awarded Ph.D, one scholar submitted the theses and four are pursuing their Ph.Ds.

The *Centre for Women's Development Studies (CWDS)*, Delhi, concentrated its research on asset creation and rural development under MGNREGA, the political economy of sex selection, community health workers' programmes, and women in contemporary India etc. Five projects were completed and fourteen were in progress. Four books and 16 research papers/ chapters in reputed journals and edited books were published by the

faculty of the Institute. During the year, 39 scholars were pursuing their Ph.D. In addition, the Centre continued to publish its journal '*Indian Journal of Gender Studies*'. The Centre also organized 14 seminars/ conferences/ workshops on various themes.

The focus of research activities of *Council for Social Development (CSD)*, Hyderabad has been to study and document deaths in sewage & septic tanks, tribal development in Odisha, cultural disparities among the tribes in India, land markets, rising agricultural land prices and their implications for agricultural and allied activities, socio-economic profile of fishing communities in Telangana, educational attainments and challenges of denotified, Nomadic and Semi-nomadic tribes in selected states etc. The Council published five books, completed six projects, and eight projects are in progress. A total number of 12 seminars/ conferences/ workshops/ lectures were conducted during the year.

The research work carried out by *Giri Institute of Development Studies (GIDS)*, Lucknow was focused on impact assessment of disaster and trends in sustaining recovery in Uttarakhand, survey of child labour in selected districts of U.P, job search and hiring practices in Urban labour markets in India, evaluation of participatory vegetable seed production, evaluation of farmers' empowerment for high harvest of pulses in central zone of U.P, estimation of district level poverty in Uttarakhand, import-export of various commodities in Uttarakhand, development of composite indicators to measure backwardness of various districts in Uttarakhand, evaluation of agricultural technologies, and electoral studies etc. During the year, the institute completed 20 projects while another seven projects are in progress. The institute published five books, 15 research papers in various journals. In addition, the institute conducted 11 seminars/ workshops/ conferences/ training programmes.

The focus of the research at the *Gujarat Institute of Development Research (GIDR), Ahmedabad* has been on challenges of feminised agriculture, impact study of fair trade certified tea in the hired labour sector, coping strategies and costs of accessing safe water among smart cities, industrialization in India, rising powers, labour standards and the governance of global production networks in India, housing programmes in Gujarat State, inter-generational relations in households with elderly, National level monitoring of rural development programmes, open defecation free villages, and smallholder cotton producers etc. During the year, the Institute completed 14 research projects and 18 projects were in progress. The faculty of the Institute published 10 research papers and 12 working/ occasional papers. The institute conducted six seminars/ conferences/ workshops and four research scholars were pursuing their Ph.Ds.

The research programme of the *Indian Institute of Education (IIE), Pune* was focused on strengthening of elementary education, rituality and rationality in the Ambedkarite Movement in Maharashtra, and critical study of Government policies with regard to minorities' education etc. During the year, one project was completed and five projects are in progress. 10 scholars are pursuing their Ph.D. and one scholar was awarded Ph.D. The institute conducted six seminars/conferences/ workshops. The faculty published one book, 18 research papers in various journals and edited book volumes.

The research work undertaken by the *Institute of Development Studies (IDS), Jaipur* was related to institutionalizing community engagement for urban sanitation, safe cities and safe public spaces for women and girls in Jaipur, animal husbandry sector and farmers under liberalized market regime in India, impact assessment on the implementation of the revival package for short terms cooperative credit structure in

selected states, livelihood insecurity in India's urban informal sector, and social and economic issues of the Muslim community of India etc. During the year, six projects were completed while another six projects are in progress. The Institute conducted seven seminars/ workshops/lectures. The faculty of the Institute published five research papers and seven occasional papers and reports. Five scholars are pursuing their Ph.D. at the Institute.

Research activities of the *Institute of Economic Growth (IEG), Delhi* were related to forecasting agricultural output using space, agro-meteorology and land based observation, coordinated horticulture assessment and management using geoinformatics, litchi production and market, reassessment of national parameters for project appraisal in India, promotion of safe water, sanitation and hygiene in the areas of Delhi, cost of inaction in family planning in India, disparities in maternal and child health care, relationship between wholesale prices, retail prices, export prices and prices realized by the Farmers, food inflation at National and State level, role of coastal ecosystems in resilience of coastal communities to tropical storms, tradeoff between economic activities and ecological index, public acceptance and environmental impacts of fossil fuel subsidy reform, valuation of water provisioning services of forests in Kailash sacred landscape, comparative assessment of central health financing schemes, review of Indian manufacturing sector performance and constraints, prevalence of early marriage, domestic violence and its impact on women's health in India, longitudinal ageing study in India, reproductive health behaviour of tribes in Himachal Pradesh, gender differentials in economic security and function health, and prevalence and risk factors of pregnancy wastage among women in India etc. The institute completed 30 research projects and 58 projects are in progress. The

Institute organized 27 workshops/seminars/training programmes, etc. Two scholars were awarded Ph.D. and 27 scholars are working for their Ph.D. The institute published 5 books, 42 working papers/monographs and 68 research papers/ chapters in various journals and edited books.

The Institute of Public Enterprise (IPE), Hyderabad conducted studies on water resource management and corporate social responsibility in oil, gas and mining sector etc. Apart from research, the institute provides courses on MBA (PE) and PGDCS. The institute completed two research projects and 10 projects were in progress. During the year, five books/reports and 19 research papers in journals were published. In addition, the institute organized 38 seminars/conferences/training programmes and workshops. 43 scholars are pursuing their Ph.D work, two submitted their thesis and five scholars were awarded degree.

The Institute for Social and Economic Change (ISEC), Bangalore focused its research on impact of Neem-Coated Urea on production, farmers' suicides in Karnataka, trade, gender and food security with a special reference to tea plantation in the Nilgiris, financial viability and sustainability of old age pension scheme for building and construction workers in Karnataka, butterfly farming in India, impact of education and employment on the economy of Scheduled Tribes of North-East India, decentralisation and education in Karnataka, impact of climate change on vulnerable sections with special reference to SCs/STs and women in Karnataka, urban governance and local democracy, and Karnataka state fiscal transfers to local bodies etc. During the year, 27 research projects were completed and 50 are at different stages of completion. The institute published nine books/ reports, 62 research papers in various journals and brought out seven monographs and 30 working/occasional

papers. It conducted 27 seminars/workshops. Besides this, eight scholars were awarded Ph.D., seven submitted their theses and 50 scholars are pursuing their research work.

The thrust area of research at the *Institute for Studies in Industrial Development (ISID), New Delhi* has been on asset quality of scheduled commercial banks, emerging patterns of outsourcing and contracting in pharmaceutical manufacturing in India, India's recent inward FDI experience, foreign direct investment in India and the role of tax havens, and changing perspectives of women's work and decline in female labour force participation rate in rural India etc. During the period, four research projects were completed and 12 projects are in progress. The institute published seven books/reports, 17 research papers and 15 working/occasional papers. The Institute organized seven seminars/workshops.

The Madhya Pradesh Institute of Social Science Research (MPISS), Ujjain (M.P.) undertakes inter-disciplinary research in social sciences with special emphasis on social, economic and political inclusion of tribals, developing service delivery standards for Gram Panchayats, inadequacy of permanent teaching faculty and its impact on quality of higher education, National Level Monitoring of rural development programmes in selected districts of Bihar, electoral studies, livelihood transition and security among scheduled tribes in Madhya Pradesh, and baseline survey of Gram Panchayats in selected districts of Madhya Pradesh etc. During the year, the institute completed 14 projects and another four are at various stages of completion. The faculty published six research papers in various journals and edited books. The Institute published its own journals '*Madhya Pradesh Journal of Social Sciences*' and '*Madhya Pradesh Samajik Vigyan Anusandhan Journal*'. It also organized 12 seminars/lectures. Three scholars

were awarded Ph.D, and two submitted their theses.

The *Madras Institute of Development Studies (MIDS), Chennai* focused its research on Cauvery delta combating climate change, socio-economic status of tribals in Tamil Nadu, impact of new growth strategies for small and medium farmers in Tamil Nadu, vulnerability, State and social protection in Tamil Nadu, and new directions in social policy etc. During the year, six research projects were completed and 18 projects were in progress. The institute published three books/ reports, 23 research papers and brought out 13 working papers. The institute conducted 34 seminars/conferences/workshops during the year. One scholar was awarded Ph.D. and 36 scholars are pursuing their research work under Ph.D. programme.

The research focus of the *Nabakrushna Choudhury Centre for Development Studies (NKCCDS), Bhubaneshwar, Odisha* was on inclusiveness of human development in India, zero budget natural farming, evaluation study on integrated low cost sanitation scheme in Odisha, monitoring of rural development programmes in selected districts of West Bengal, and social impact assessment of land acquisition in selected areas of Odisha etc. During the period under review, the Centre completed seven research projects while another seven are in progress. The faculty also published 10 research papers in various journals and organized 30 conferences/seminars/workshops. During the year under report, 10 Ph.D. scholars are pursuing their research work.

The *Omeo Kumar Das Institute of Social Change and Development (OKDISCD), Guwahati* was focused its research on issues relating to the gender, empowerment and conflict in South

Asia, building sustainable economic corridors in Northeast India, supporting the CSR endeavours of North Eastern Electric Power Cooperation, documentation, and monitoring and evaluation of corporate social responsibility projects for National Hydroelectric Power Corporation etc. The institute completed five research projects and eight projects are in progress. The faculty published nine research papers, and two books/research reports. Also, the institute organized 21 seminars/workshops/training programmes during the year under report.

The major research areas covered by the *Sardar Patel Institute of Social and Economic Research (SPISER), Ahmedabad*, during the year, were National level monitoring and evaluation of rural development schemes, National level monitoring and evaluation of Swachhh Bharat Mission, digital connectivity and rural development, drivers and obstacles of female labour force participation and structure of wages and understanding the progress in development among the Scheduled Tribe Caste in Gujarat etc. During the period, two research projects were completed and six projects are in progress. The Institute published one book and nine research articles in various journals/edited books and conducted four seminars / conferences. During the year, three scholars are pursuing their Ph.D at the Institute.

The major activities of the Research Institutes during 2017-18 are given at Appendix-11. The details of Research Journals being published by ICSSR Research Institutes is given at Table No. 2.28

The quantitative research output of ICSSR Research Institutes for the year 2017-18 and also ever since their coming under the ICSSR Grant-in-Aid scheme is provided in Table No. 2.29 and 2.30 respectively.

The services provided by the library include online access to Indian and foreign reading room facilities, documentation services, reference services, and photocopying services. The digitization/software services are also available. Cataloguing of books is going on through e-Granthalaya- software of National Informatics Centre, Government of India. Library

The library is a specialized research resource centre for a comprehensive collection of published and unpublished material relating to Indian women. It provides access to the following online databases access to its users which are funded by ICSSR: (i) JSTOR (ii) IndiaStat. The library has total collection of 692 Journals/ Newsletters and 1074 back volumes of Journals/ Periodicals. It purchased 200 books and received 46 on complementary basis. The library purchased 40 Indian journals and received 81 (56 Indian and 25 Foreign journal) on complimentary basis.

During 2017-2018, a total of 2,360 plus records have been added to the Koha catalogue of which 1900 plus records are articles from journal and newspaper of which 1170 records are full text newspaper clippings. 460 plus records of books, monographs, reports, conference documents have also been added. The Library functions are fully automated using the library management software LIBSYS for cataloguing and distribution of the library resources and is equipped with Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) to search the library resources for specific titles. The library also provides for the services including search of references, reprographic service and electronic document delivery wherever feasible. The library provides for the access to its collections from other libraries in the city with which it collaborates. During the year, the library has subscription of 56 international and 59 Indian journals including 56 journals in the electronic format. The library has electronic databases such as surveys of the National Sample Survey Organisation, Decadal Population Census, subscription to data services such as Indiastat.com and CMIE's Economic Outlook either in CD ROMs or through Online access, J-Stor and Econlit. The library has a collection of 7025 bound volumes of past issues of journals and periodicals. During the period under report, 427 new books were acquired by the library.

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of Indian Council of Social Science Research, New Delhi the year ended 31 March 2018


We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), New Delhi as at 31 March 2018, the Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section 20(1) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971. The audit has been entrusted for the period upto 2018-19. These financial statements include the accounts of six Regional Centres (RCs) of the ICSSR. These financial statements are the responsibility of the ICSSR's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

Only two sets of Receipts & Payments Account and Income & Expenditure Account have been prepared i.e. one for ICSSR Headquarters and another for its RCs. This does not give a complete view of the financial activities of ICSSR. This is being pointed out since 2009-10 but remedial action has not been taken. Further the schedules of the Balance Sheet & Income & Expenditure accounts gives information only about ICSSR Headquarters and not for RCs. The Schedules for the consolidated figures of ICSSR Headquarters & RCs have not been prepared. The accounts are therefore incomplete.
3. Because of the significance of the matters discussed in Para no. 2 above, we are not able to form an opinion on the accounts of Indian Council of Social Science Research, New Delhi for the year 2017-18.

SCHEDULE - 23

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES —

1. ACCOUNTING CONVENTION

1.1 The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention, unless otherwise stated and on the accrual method of accounting. However accounts of Chintan Guest House and Pension Fund are being maintained on cash basis.

2. INVENTORY VALUATION

2.1 Publications are valued at cost or realizable value whichever is less.

3. FIXED ASSETS

3.1 Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition inclusive of inward freight, duties and taxes and incidental and direct expenses related to Acquisition. In respect of projects involving construction, related pre-operational expenses (including interest on loans for specific Project prior to its completion), form part of the value of the assets capitalized.

3.2 Gifted/Donated assets, if any, are valued at the declared value where available; if not available, the value is estimated based on the present market value adjusted with reference to the physical condition of the asset. They are set-up by credit to Capital Fund and merged with the Fixed Assets of the Institutions. Depreciation is charged at the rates applicable to the respective assets.

3.3 Books received as gifts, are valued at selling prices printed on the books. Where they are not printed, the value is taken as "NIL".

4. DEPRECIATION ON FIXED ASSETS

4.1 Depreciation is provided on written down value method as per rates specified in the Income Tax Act 1961.

4.2 In respect of additions to/deductions from fixed assets during the year, depreciation is considered as per Income Tax Act 1961 i.e. Assets purchased before 30th September or after 30th September the depreciation is provided in full or half respectively

5. ACCOUNTING FOR SALES

5.1 Sales are accounted for net of sales returns and rebate/discount.

6. REVENUE RECOGNITION

The following items of income and expenses are accounted for on cash basis.

(a) Incomes

(i) Claims against Central/Sate Government and their agencies/Banks/Others, which are prima facie under dispute:- There is no dispute

(ii) Royalties' receivable by the Council: There is no uniform policy followed by the ICSSR. The percentage of royalty differs from publisher to publisher and publication to publication.

(b) Expenses

(i) All disputed taxes/levies of Central/State Govt.:- There is no dispute

(ii) Royalties payable by the Council: No royalty is payable by the Council.

7. SUBSCRIPTIONS/MEMBERSHIP FEE

7.1 Subscription/Membership fee paid in the form of books/Journals and Online Database for one year will be treated as expense in the year of payment.

8. GOVT. GRANTS/ SUBSIDIES

8.1 Government Grants are accounted on realization basis. However, where a sanction for release of grant pertaining to the financial year is received before 31st March and the grant is actually received in the next financial year, the grant is accounted on accrual basis and an equal amount is shown as recoverable from the Grantor.

8.2 To the extent utilized towards capital expenditure (on accrual basis) government grants are transferred to the Capital Fund.

8.3 Government grants for meeting Revenue Expenditure (on accrual basis) are treated, to the extent utilized as income of the year in which they are realized.

8.4 Unutilized grants (including advances paid out of such grants) are carried forward and exhibited as a liability in the Balance Sheet.

8.5 Government grants/Non Government grants are treated as Revenue/Capital Grants based on the usage/mandate of Grant.

9. FOREIGN CURRENCY TRANSACTIONS

9.1 Transactions denominated in foreign currency are accounted at the exchange rate prevailing at the date of the transaction

10. RETIREMENT BENEFITS

10.1 Liability towards gratuity payable on death/retirement of employees is accounted based on actual basis.

10.2 Leave encashment benefit to the employees is accounted based on actual basis

11. EARMARKED/ ENDOWMENT FUNDS

11.1 The long terms funds are earmarked for specific purposes. Each of the funds has

a separate bank account. Those with large balances also have investments in Government Securities, Debentures and Bonds and Term Deposits with Banks. The assets created out of Earmarked Funds where the ownership Vests in the Institution, are merged with the assets of the Institution by crediting an equal amount to the Capital Fund. The balance in the respective funds is carried forward and is represented on the assets side by the balance at Bank, Investments and accrued interest.

11.2 Endowments are funds received from various individual donors, Trusts and other organizations, for establishing Chairs and for Medals & Prizes, as specified by the Donors. While each of the Endowment funds has its own investment there is one savings Bank Account for all the Endowment funds, as the un-invested balances against them are negligible

The income from investments of each Endowment Fund is added to the Fund. The interest on Savings Bank a/c is allocated to all the Endowment funds in the ratio of the year end closing balances in each fund. The expenditure on Medals & Prizes is met from the interest earned on investment of the respective Endowment Funds and the balances is carried forward. In respect of Chairs, however, the corpus of the Endowment is also used.

The balances are represented by Investment in RBI Bonds and Fixed Deposits and balance in the Saving Bank Account common for all Endowments, and Accrued Interest on Investments.

12. STATUS OF REGIONAL CENTRES

12.1 Un-audited Accounts of all regional centres are being incorporated with Council's accounts since 2005-06 onwards.


13. INCOME TAX






