1 Academic Dependency in the Social Sciences: Structural Reality and 52056 Intellectual Challenges/ Kathinka, Sinha-Kerkhoff (ed.) and Syed Farid Alatas,(ed.)-- Manohar: New Delhi, 2010; 333p.

The above book examines the academic dependence of diversely situated Southern scholars. Even though geography may play a different function in today's globalised society, the contributors to this volume all agree that the location of individuals has not become meaningless. However, there is limited knowledge about the impact of place among academicians differently located in the South and of the costs and benefits of academic globalization. The main purpose of this book, therefore, is to increase knowledge about the net result of such a calculus today for various regions in the South. Though all scholars in this book look upon academic dependency as a problem, there are differences of opinion as to what constitutes academic dependency, what its manifestations are, and how to cope with academic dependency. The papers in this volume deal with two major differences or levels of the problem of academic dependency, that is, theoretical and practical. The editors think it is essential that academic dependency be understood and dealt with along these two levels as this will enable an appreciation of the magnitude of the problem and serious consideration of the options available as measures to overcome academic dependency are considered.

2 Access to Medicines in India/ Sakthivel Selvaraj (ed.), Dinesh Abrol (ed.) and 52055 K.M. Gopakumar (ed.)-- Academic Foundation: New Delhi, 2014; 259p.

This book examines in depth the major obstacles to access to medications in the country. It highlights several themes, considered impediments to access to medicines while at the same time proposing viable policy options. Some of these themes include inadequate investment in public health care, inefficient and unreliable procurement and distribution of drugs, unaffordable drug prices, and pharmaceutical patents. The book calls for scaling up investment and replicating the success of centralized procurement and decentralized distribution model of drugs, as in the state of Tamil Nadu, which will pave the way for universal access to essential medicines in India.

According to this book, current computer technology doubles in power roughly every two years, a phenomenon known as Moore's Law. This steady rise is expected to come to a stop soon. Digital technology will change. Although digital computers dominate today's world, there are alternative ways to compute which might be better and more efficient than digital computation. After Digital looks at where the field of computation began and where it might be headed and offers predictions about a collaborative future relationship between human cognition and mechanical computation.

9 Banking and Financial Markets: How Banks and Financial Technology are 52073 Reshaping Financial Markets/ Bilan, Andrada-- Palgrave Macmillan: Switzerland, 2019; ix, 221p.

The above book investigates the interaction of traditional and modern banking, as well as the economic benefits and costs of this new financial ecosystem, using recent empirical research in banking and finance and examining the effects of increased financial sophistication on a specific dimension of the loan contract. The traditional role of a bank was to transfer funds from savers to investors, engage in maturity transformation, screen for borrower risk, and monitor borrower effort in doing so. A typical loan contract was set up along six simple dimensions: the amount, the interest rate, the expected credit risk (determining both the probability of default for the loan and the expected loss given default), the required collateral, the currency, and the lending technology. However, the modern banking industry today has a broad scope, offering a range of sophisticated financial products, a wider geography -- including exposure to countries with various currencies, regulations, and monetary policy regimes -and an increased reliance on financial innovation and technology. These new bank business models have had repercussions on the loan contract. In particular, the main components and risks of a loan contract can now be hedged on the market, utilizing interest rate swaps, foreign exchange transactions, credit default swaps, and securitization. Securitized loans can often be pledged as collateral, thus facilitating new lending. And lending technology is evolving from one-to-one meetings between a loan officer and a borrower, at a bank branch, towards potentially disruptive technologies such as peer-to-peer lending, crowdfunding or digital wallet services.

10 Between Survival and Status: The Counter-Hegemonic Geopolitics of Iran/ 52060 Saraswat, Deepika-- Macmillan Publishers Indian Private Ltd: Chennai, 2022; vi,212p.

This book explores how the Islamic and revolutionary identity of Iran has been (re)produced in the geopolitical discourse of Iranian state elites over forty years from the Islamic Revolution in 1979 to 2019. The point of departure for this book is that forty years since its foundation, the Islamic Republic of Iran has pursued a counter-hegemonic geopolitics steeped in the Islamic ideology articulated by its founder Ayatollah Khomeini.

11 Beyond Public Policy: A Public Action Languages Approach/ Kevin, Spink 52090 Peter-- Edward Elgar: United Kingdom, 2019; viii; 238p.

The book offers practical advice and real-life case studies on public policy. This is puzzling: why, if politicians can secure power through competition, would we observe collaboration in Congress? Using evidence from 200 interviews with politicians from Argentina and a novel dataset from 23 Argentine legislative chambers over 18 years, Gendering Legislative Behavior reexamines traditional notions of competitive democracy by evaluating patterns of collaboration among legislators.

26 Managing The Risks of Extreme Events and Disasters to Advance Climate 52067 Change Adaption: Special Report of The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change/ Christopher, B. Field (ed.)-- Cambridge University Press: New York, 2012; x, 582p.

The work emphasized extreme weather and climate events, interacting with exposed and vulnerable human and natural systems, which can lead to disasters. This Special Report explores the social as well as physical dimensions of weather- and climate-related disasters, considering opportunities for managing risks at local to international scales. SREX was approved and accepted by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) on 18 November 2011 in Kampala, Uganda.

27 Misreading Law Misreading Democracy/ Nourse, Victoria-- Harvard University 52093 Press: United Kingdom, 2016; 259p.

This book argues about American law schools extol democracy but teaches little about its most basic institution, the Congress. Interpreting statutes is lawyers' most basic task, but law professors rarely focus on how statutes are made. This misguided pedagogy, says Victoria Nourse, undercuts the core of legal practice. It may even threaten the continued functioning of American democracy, as contempt for the legislature becomes entrenched in legal education and judicial opinions. Misreading Law, Misreading Democracy turns a spotlight on lawyers' and judges' pervasive ignorance about how Congress makes law. 28 Negotiating Climate Change: A Forensic Analysis/ Kellow, Aynsley J.-- Edward 52087 Elgar Publishing Ltd.: United Kingdom, 2018; vii,173p.

The work examines how an error in global meta-policy set climate change negotiations on an unproductive course. The decision to base negotiations on the Montreal Protocol and overlook the importance of interests, it argues, institutionalized an approach doomed to fail. By analyzing interests, science, and norms in the process, and the neglect of 'interactive unilateralism, learning was delayed until the more promising Paris Agreement was finally concluded, only to encounter a Trump Presidency, which (ironically) might offer further learning opportunities.

29 Productivity and The Pandemic: Challenges and Insights from Covid-19/ Philip 52089 McCann (ed.) and Tim Vorley (ed.)-- Edward Elgar Publishing Limited: United Kingdom, 2021; xxi, 305p.

At various levels of policy, planning, implementation, and assessment, it shows these environmental education/ESD activities in relation to the administrative, economic, social, cultural, and ecological realities of each nation. The discussions in this book extend beyond formal education systems like schools, higher education, and pre-service and in-service teacher preparation to community education and education initiatives conceptualized with the goal of sustainability. All initiatives will demonstrate how each country at its own pace contributes to moving ESD from the periphery to the core of education initiatives.

The book attempts to reorient the dominant narratives with an interdisciplinary approach to explore and understand various identities, routes, and sites with a focus on the Western Indian Ocean region, by offering perspectives of a multidisciplinary group of academics, policymakers, diplomats, archaeologists, and museum and heritage experts. 32 Rural Credit and Financial Penetration in Himachal Pradesh/ Verma, Satish-- 52065 Centre for Research in Rural and Industrial Development: Chandigarh, 2019; xxi, 215p.

The book fills the void in the scant literature on banking in Himachal Pradesh. Banking in Himachal Pradesh though remains mostly rudimentary yet it has expanded immensely particularly in ht rural areas reducing the rural-urban disparities. But, they have exhibited a high order of credit discipline. These and several other issues, using the field survey data, have been comprehensively analyzed in this book.

33 Teaching Design and Technology Creatively/ Clare, Benson (ed.) and Suzanne 52083 Lawson (ed.)-- Routledge: New York, 2017; xv, 184p.

This book is packed full of practical ideas, Teaching Design and Technology Creatively is a stimulating source of guidance for busy trainees and practising teachers. Grounded in the latest research, it offers a wealth of suggestions to foster creative development in D&T and supports teachers in providing their students with more authentic, enjoyable experiences.

34 The Challenge of Development: Displacement in Nagaland 1947-2010/ 52062 Fernandes, Walter-- North-Eastern Social Research Centre: Assam, 2017; xiii, 288p.

The work studies the extent of land acquisition and displacement from 1947-2010 in Nagaland, and its impact on the people affected and proposes a development paradigm that can combine economic growth and infrastructure building with people's development.

The Heart of The Constitution: How the Bill of Rights became the Bill of Rights/ 52095
Magliocca, Gerard N.,-- Illustrated edition; United States of America, 2018; xii, 235p.

The work states the untold story of the most celebrated part of the Constitution. Until the twentieth century, few Americans called the first ten constitutional amendments drafted by James Madison in 1789 and ratified by the states in 1791 the Bill of Rights. Even more surprising, when people finally started doing so between the Spanish-American War and World War II, the Bill of Rights was usually invoked to justify increasing rather than restricting the authority of the federal government. President Franklin D. Roosevelt played a key role in that development, first by using the Bill of Rights to justify the expansion of national regulation under the New Deal, and then by transforming the Bill of Rights into a patriotic rallying cry against Nazi Germany. It was only after the Cold War began that the Bill of Rights took on its modern form as the most powerful symbol of the limits on government power. These are just some of the revelations about the Bill of Rights in Gerard Magliocca's The Heart of the Constitution. For example, we are accustomed to seeing the Bill of Rights at the end of the Constitution, but Madison wanted to put them in the middle of the document. Why was his plan rejected and what impact did that have on constitutional law? Today we also venerate the first ten amendments as the Bill of Rights, but many Supreme Court opinions say that only the first eight or first nine amendments. Why was that and why did that change? The Bill of Rights that emerges from Magliocca's fresh historical examination is a living text that means something different for each generation and reflects the great ideas of the Constitution--individual freedom, democracy, states' rights, judicial review, and national power in times of crisis.

But what if this sense of mobility is an ideological bubble that provides the illusion of freedom whilst limiting our mobility or even keeping us immobile? 40 The Muslim Brotherhood and The West: A History of Enmity and Engagement/ 52098 Frampton, Martyn-- The Belknap press of Harvard university press: Cambridge, Massachusetts, 2018; ix, 661p.

This book examines the history of the relationship between the world's largest and most influential Islamist organization, the Muslim Brotherhood, and the western powers that have dominated the Middle East, the United Kingdom and the United States. It examines the relationship that has existed in the shadows of public attention and scholarly interest; where it has been considered, this subject has been dominated by conspiracy theory and hyperbole. By contrast, this book draws on the memoirs and publications of the Brotherhood (in both Arabic and English), as well as extensive archival research in both London and Washington to offer an in-depth understanding of how relations between this movement and the West have oscillated between a posture of enmity (on both sides), to moments when engagement has been contemplated and occasionally attempted. In the process, the book offers an important new perspective on the history of the Brotherhood, in particular highlighting the centrality of ideas about 'the West' to the group's worldview. It has also evaluated the impact on those who pay the price of development planning in India. One is left with the impression that the GDP growth-based view prevails in development planning in India.

43 The Welfare State Revisited/ Jose, Antonio Ocampo (ed.) and Joseph, E. 52080 Stiglitzb (ed.)-- Columbia University Press: New York, 2010; xxiii, 384 p.

The title 'The Welfare State Revisited', argues that, more than ever, there is a need for a strong welfare state. In particular, it is essential to face the strong

inequality trends that have been in place in large parts of the world since the last decades of the twentieth century. The book also argues that a twenty-firstcentury welfare state will have to be different from those of the nineteenth and twentieth centuries. It must be redesigned in a way that is consistent with a coherent vision of its role in the economic and social system today. And it must respond to the demands generated in many parts of the world by demographic changes, the changing role of the family, new features of labour markets, technological change, and the fiscal constraints created by tax competition in the globalized world. To do this, it must borrow from research in recent decades that has provided new insights into the roles that the welfare state has to perform and how to design a better, more efficient, and equitable system, research that is summarized by the authors in this volume. The volume is organized into two parts. The first analyzes the conceptual issues associated with the challenges outlined above. The second focuses on the experience of specific regions or countries. These experiences are those of the European Union, Scandinavia, the United States (also analyzed in several chapters in the first part), Latin America (the region of the develop- ing world that has had the most significant advances in social protection in the early twenty-first century), and one of the most interesting initiatives put in place in the developing world in recent times, India's National Rural Employment Guarantee Act.

44 Transmitting Rights: International Organizations and The Diffusion of Human 52096 Rights Practices/ Greenhill, Brian-- Oxford University Press: New York, 2015; x,194p.

The work constructed the structures that drive the global diffusion of human rights norms, Brian Greenhill argues that we need to look beyond institutions that are explicitly committed to human rights and instead focus on the dense web of international government organizations (IGOs)-some big, some small; some focused on human rights; some not-that has arisen in the last two generations. While most of these organizations have no direct connection to human rights issues, their participation in broader IGO networks has important implications for the human rights practices of their member states. Featuring a rigorous empirical analysis, Transmitting Rights shows that countries tend to adopt similar human rights practices to those of their IGO partners, whether for better or worse. Greenhill argues that IGOs constitute a tightly-woven fabric of ties between states and that this network provides an important channel through which states can influence the behaviour of others. Indeed, his analysis suggests that a policy of isolating "rogue" states is probably self-defeating given that this will reduce their exposure to some of the more positive IGO-based influences on their human rights. Greenhill's analysis of the role of IGOs in rights diffusion will not only increase our understanding of the international politics of human rights but will also reshape how we think about the role of international institutions in world politics.

45 Tribal Heritage: An Overlooked Chapter of Indian History/ Misra, Promode 52054 Kumar-- Aayu publications: New Delhi, 2018; xxvii, 333p.
